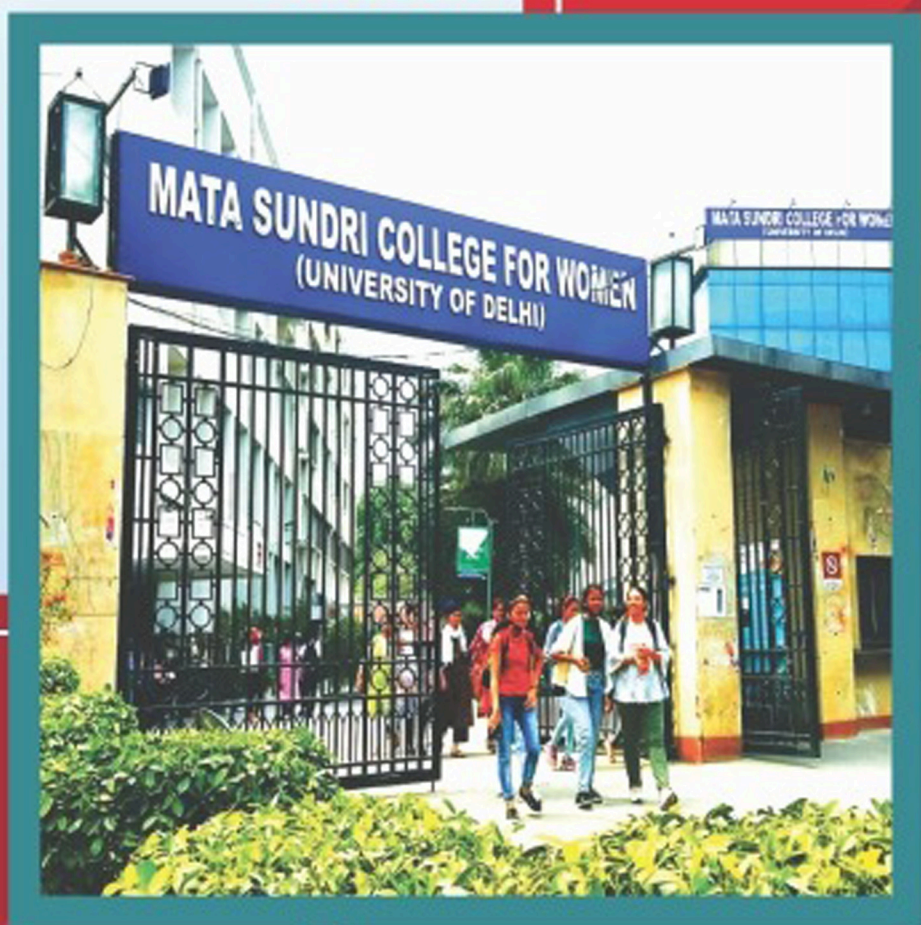

## FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK



It is a matter of honor that in this academic year, National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) granted approval to the college for the 4-year Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) with B.A. B.Ed. dual-major holistic Bachelor's degree in Education. This is a reflection of the pedagogical excellence as well as the academic rigor of the faculty. The college successfully conducted the Recruitment process for permanent Assistant Professors across all the departments. The pending promotions for Associate Professorship and Professorship were also coordinated. While we cherish the spirit of stability and progression, let's continue to strive for newer heights and intellectual horizons.

The crowning glory for the college has been the foundation ceremony for the hostel premises organized on 12 December 2023. Hostels in women's colleges serve as more than just accommodation facilities; they are vibrant communities where female students thrive academically, socially, and personally. With this in mind, the hostel establishment seeks to provide a safe and supportive living environment, prioritizing convenience and accessibility. I am sincerely thankful to the Chairman, Padma Shri Dr. Vikramjit Singh Sahney ji for his indispensable assistance to all our endeavors.

The college also signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to facilitate and consolidate international cooperation in education and research with Science Uzbekistan, Alfraganus University, Tashkent, and Tashkent Institute of Chemical Technology. For the first time, Delhi University participated in the Folk/Tribal Dance competition category of the programme held by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) organisation and Mata Sundri College for Women became the first college to represent DU in this category. It also served as the nodal college for the same.

Under the Research Mentoring programme, students across disciplines pursued research and successfully completed the projects. ## **ENDEAVOURS TOWARDS INCLUSIVENESS**

### **SCHOLARSHIP AND FEE CONCESSION**

For the academic year, a total amount of Rs. 13,67,856 (Rupees Thirteen Lakhs Sixty – Seven Thousand and Eight Hundred and Fifty-Six Only) was given as Fee concession to 122 students. Two students were awarded Fee concession for Rs. 20,000/- in total under Mrs. Gulbir Kaur Fee Concession scheme. 2 students were awarded the “Raj Kalra Psychology Scholarship” amounting Rs. 1100/- each. 3 students were awarded the “Usha Aggarwal Tejwita Scholarship” amounting to Rs 9,300/- in total. 3 students received Rs 900/- each under the “Ulfat Rai Jain Scholarship”. 2 students were awarded the “Sultan Chand Dropadi Devi Scholarship” amounting to Rs. 5100/- each. 23 students were awarded the “Usha Devi Sanskrit Scholarship” amounting to a total Rs. 48,700/-.

### **NSP – Central Sector Scheme for Scholarships For College and University Students**

Operational since 2008 the objective of this scheme is to provide financial assistance to the meritorious students having family income of less than Rs. 6 lakh per annum. 9 students were awarded this scholarship.

### **Kalpana Chawla Chatravriti Yojana – Himachal Pradesh**

Launched in 2012-13 by the Government of Himachal Pradesh in honor of the late astronaut Kalpana Chawla, the "Kalpana Chawla Chatravriti Yojana" is a scholarship scheme that provides financial assistance to girls of Himachal Pradesh who belong to economically weaker sections and wish to pursue higher education. 1 student was selected for this scholarship.

### **NSP Post Matric Scholarship for Students with Disabilities**

The aim of this scholarship is to help students with disabilities to pursue higher studies. 9 students from the college have been awarded this scholarship.

### **Delhi Government E-Dist Post Matric Scholarship Schemes for SC and OBC**

This scheme was started with the purpose of awarding scholarships to meritorious students belonging to economically weaker sections of minority community. 3 students from the college have benefited from this scheme.

### **E-Dist Merit Scholarship Scheme by Delhi Government**

The objective of this scheme is to support higher education amongst the minority students. 30 students have benefitted from this scheme.

### **Marga Schulze Merit Scholarship Scheme for Higher Education of Girls with Visual Impairment**

This scholarship is being provided by Marga Schulze Foundation (Germany) for visually impaired girls to support their higher education such as undergraduate, postgraduate and B.Ed. courses. AICB has been implementing the Scheme since 2000-200. For the year 2021 – 2022, 9 visually impaired students from our college have awarded this scholarship for the amount ranging from Rs. 5000/- to Rs. 8000/-. 1 student was awarded this scholarship for the year 2022-23.
