IS MEDIA TAKING US AWAY OR TOWARDS REALITY?



The given article reflects the ideas of analytical philosophy and of many modern philosophers and is hence credited to them, as understood commonly Media is any form of communication,

The types of media herein relevant to discussion are print and entertainment media, any further referral to media in the text will hence mean either or both of these. By reality we mean the actuality of things, can be in either materialistic or intellectual form. The correlation of media and reality is one of a great too many words and hence it's requested to ignore the elimination of antithesis and instead draw upon the application of the given matter at hand. Before we proceed it's necessary to establish irrefutable grounds, such as media is established on reality whether subjective or objective and no enquiry of philosophy transcends the world of science and hence we shall use psychology and logical ploys to understand this correlation, contemplation through these means reveals the objective reality of a subject, here we mean to arrive on that objective reality hence a plea to suspend our disbelief based on subjective interpretation clouding our judgement.
