- 16.2. The setf-appraisal methodology, as per Cluste 6.0 and its sub-clustes and Clustes 6.1 to 6.4 and all the sub-clustes contained therein and as per Tables 1 to 5 of Appendix II, as per eligibility, shall form purt of the service agreement/record.
- 16.3 Inter-se seniority between the direct recruited and teachers promoted under CAS

The inter-se sensitive of a direct metals shall be determined with reference to the date of joining and for the teachers promised under the CAS with reference to the date of eligibility as indicated in the recommendations of the selection committee of the respective cardidates. The rules and regulations of the respective Central/State Government shall apply, for all other mattern of sensitivity.

17.0 Code of Professional Ethics

I. Teachers and their Responsibilities:

Whoever adopts teaching as a profession assumes the obligation to combact himself / herself in occordance with the ideal of the profession. A teacher is commantly under the serutiny of his students and the society at large. Therefore, every teacher should see that there is no incompatibility between his precepts and practice. The missoul ideals of education which have already been set forth and which befule should seek to incultate among students must be his/her own ideals. The profession further requires that the teacher should be ealth, patient and communicative by temperaturest and annuble in disposition.

Teacher should:

- (i) Adhere to a responsible pattern of conduct and demanter expected of them by the community,
- (ii) Manage their private affairs in a roomer consistent with the dignity of the profession,
- (iii) Seek to make professional growth-continuous through study and research;
- (iv) Express free and frank opinion by participation at professional meetings, seminars, conferences exc., towards the contribution of knowledge;
- Maintain active membership of professional organisations and strive to improve education and profession through them;
- (vi) Perform their duties in the form of teaching, tutorials, practicals, seminars and mesearch work, conscientiously and with dedication;
- (viii) Discourage and not includge in plagiarism and other non ethical behaviour in teaching and research;
- (viii) Abide by the Act. Statute and Ordinance of the University and to unspect its ideals, vision, mission, cultural practices and multities;
- (ix) Co-operate and assist in carrying out the functions relating to the educational responsibilities of the college and the university, such as assisting in appraising applications for admission, arbitring and cramelling students as well as assisting the conduct of university and college examinations, including supervision, invigilation and evaluation; and
- (x) Participate in extension, co-corricular and extra-corricular activities, including the community service.

IL Teachers and Students

Teachers should:

- (i) Respect the rights and dignity of the student in expressing bis/her opinion,
- (ii) Deal justly and impartially with students regardless of their religion, caste, gender, political, economic, social and physical characteristics;
- (iii) Recognise the difference in aptitude and capabilities among students and strive to meet their individual needs;
- (iv) Encourage students to improve their attainments, develop their personalities and at the same time contribute to community welfare;
- liculcate among students scientific temper, spirit of inquiry and ideals of democracy, patriotism, social justice, environmental protection and peace;
- (vi) Treat the students with dignity and not behave in a virifictive manner towards any of them for any reason;
