





A two day workshop was organized by the Department of Economics, Mata Sundri CollegeforWomen, University of Delhi in association with B.A. (Programme) Society and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in Collaboration with Meghnad Desai AcademyofEconomics on 6-7 November 2020. The purpose of the workshop was to enlighten the students regarding the basic foundation, situation and critical issues of the middle class society of India. It made them learn and identify the structure, terminology and potential areas of research in this broad spectrum of arena. The keynote speaker of the workshopwasDr. Sandhya Krishnan, University of Amsterdam. PhD the from At inaugural ceremony, Teacher-In-Charge Mrs. Upasana Dhawan delivered the welcome speech, Principal MadamProf.(Dr.) Harpreet Kaur and Dr. Lokesh Kumar Gupta enlightened us with their kindandwords. First day, the session was moderated by Dr. Jasleen Kaur. Dr. Krishnan explained the origin of the word middle class from the historical perspective which was quotidiani the British Era. She covered the two questions such as how has the middle class inIndiaexpanded in the period from 1999-00 to 2011-12 and how sensitive are the results to different definitions of the middle class on 6th November. Her accountability and presentation with the tables and graphs catered the interest of the students. She also explained the economic aspect of the middle class in the current scenario. Second day, the session was hosted by Dr. Niti Arorawho who also pointed out the significance of the workshop. Dr. Krishnan answered the last two questions about how the middle class is different from the poor and affluent in terms of its spending pattern and what is its structural composition. 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

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


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participants and guest artist, Mrs. Bimla Dutta. The two-hour workshop concluded with smiling faces showcasing their artwork on screen.

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
finding her passion in nuclear

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
16. Psychology as Life Skill : An Integrative Counselling Skills Session.

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17. Report on Faculty Development Programme: Exploratory Data Analysis using Statistical Software R and SPSS

The seven day Faculty Development Programme on Exploratory Data Analysis using Statistical Software R and SPSS was organized by Department of Statistics and Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Mata Sundri College for Women in collaboration with Mahatma Hansraj Faculty Development Centre, Hansraj College (initiative of MHRD, Govt of India under Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching scheme) from 7th January 2021 to 13th January 2021. The programme was attended by 150 participants from across the country and also abroad. The intellectually stimulating programme was enriching and proved to be helpful in improving analytical skills of the faculty and research scholars who attended the session. Dr. Archana Verma, Assistant Professor, Department of Statistics, Mata Sundri College for Women, welcomed all the participants. This was followed by a formal introduction to the program by Ms. Prabhsharan Kaur, teacher in-charge, Department of Statistics. Opening remarks for the event were given by our respected Principal Prof (Dr.) Harpreet Kaur. Dr. Lokesh Kumar Gupta, Coordinator (IQAC) gave a brief account of the activities being carried out in Mata Sundri College for Women during the Covid pandemic. The programme progressed with an inaugural lecture by Prof Vikram Dayal, Institute of Economic Growth in which he focussed on how visualization is critical to data analysis and data graphics give us great insights about the data and how that can be done with ease in 'R'. The inaugural programme ended with a formal vote of thanks by Dr. Swati Kujal. The next speaker of the day was Dr. Seema Gupta, Associate Professor, Ram Lal Anand College, Delhi University, who gave an introductory lecture on statistical methods, graphics, probability distribution and hypothesis testing.



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The second day started with a lecture by Dr. Babita Goyal, Associate Professor, Ramjas College, University of Delhi. She discussed Statistical Modelling and Model Diagnostics. Participants discussed various aspects with the speaker which continued till break. The next lecture of the day was given by Dr. Hukum Chandra, National Fellow & Principal Scientist, ICAR-IASRI. This was an introductory lecture on 'R' programming. Since it was a hands-on session, the

participants found it very engaging and gave an overwhelming response. The speaker addressed all the queries of participants patiently and this marked the end of the second day.

The third day began with Dr. Hukum Chandra, who continued his session on 'R' software.

He explained data entry and its basic functionalities; demonstrated installation of packages in R script; showed how to read and write data files and how to use data editor modules in R. He also advised the participants to explore extensive online help available for R and practice by themselves. After a short break, the next session by Dr Chandra continued to discuss some of the most basic statistical tests in R. He even discussed a few of the discrete and continuous distributions and their fitting. The participants clarified their doubts and showed great enthusiasm throughout the session.

The fourth day was a break day which gave an opportunity to the participants to review and practice the content covered.

On the fifth day Dr Chandra delivered a concluding session and covered graphical representation in R. He discussed how we can plot various graphs and even customize them in R script. He also discussed correlation and how to perform basic regression analysis in R with built-in data set. The participants were satisfied with the very useful, informative and well explained session. The second session of the day was taken by Dr. Pradip Basak, Assistant Professor, Department



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of Agricultural Statistics, Uttar Banga Krishi Viswavidyalaya, West Bengal. He discussed Multivariate techniques like principal component analysis, cluster analysis and factor analysis in R. After attending sessions on R, participants were content as they could understand the reasons for its immense popularity in academia.

On the sixth day, Dr. Suresh Kumar Sharma, Professor, Department of Statistics, Punjab University, Chandigarh, discussed the key concepts of descriptive statistics. Demonstrating hands on he familiarized all with the data editor and explained how to enter the data in SPSS and import excel files in it. The session was engaging and imparted great conceptual clarity and knowledge to work in SPSS. In the following session, Dr. Sharma focussed on graphical representation of data. He talked about various commands and pathway for plotting graphs in R. He also discussed linear and multiple regression in detail. Performing hands-on with data sets he also showed how to read the outputs in SPSS.

On the seventh day, Dr Sharma delivered a concluding session and discussed basics of statistical inference, hypothesis testing, concepts of p-value and various statistical tests in SPSS. The participants appreciated his sessions for being informative and enriching. This was followed by a small valedictory session wherein Ms. Prabhsharan Kaur thanked all the organizing team

members of both the colleges, speakers and the participants. Participants also shared their views regarding the course content of the FDP and gave a unanimous view that this one week FDP was very well organized and course content was immensely informative and enriching. Dr Lokesh Kumar Gupta also thanked everyone and shared his views. The programme report was read by Dr

Swati Kujal and the formal vote of thanks was given by Dr Archana Verma which concluded the seven day FDP.



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18. A Short Term Course on "Entrepreneurial Idea Development and Skill Enhancement"

MSC unveiled UDDHAM, The Entrepreneurship Cell of Mata Sundri College for Women on 5th Feb2021. The Entrepreneurship Cell came up with a Short Term Course on "Entrepreneurial Idea Development and Skill Enhancement" in collaboration with UGC Community College, Kirori Mal College.

Inaugural of this STC could not be any better without the presence of Mr. Ravindra Nath, Ex Chairman and Managing Director, National Small industries corporation (NSIC) as our chief guest. He stated the importance of skills because that is what matters the most. He gave a few interesting examples to highlight the importance of guidance and motivation to people who are talented but just lack vision.

Few astonishing life lessons taught by him sticked to the following:

1. One who wants to achieve something should surpass everyone by taking the first step ahead.

2. The wonders made by small things are always remarkable and make a lot of difference.

3. No one can beat an empathetic person who always puts themselves in other's shoes and brings happiness in others' lives which ultimately bring joy to them.

Session 2 of day 1 was chaired by Mr. Pushpendra Kumar, Associate professor, Kirorimal College, DU. Sir laid down the foundation of this course by giving practical insights into the concept. He shared very relevant examples from day to day life.

Speaker for the second day session 1 was Mr. Shakeel Ahmad Khan, faculty of Entrepreneurship Development Program at National Small Industrial Corporation,



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MSME, Government of India. He spilled the stats that more than 50% Start up companies failed in their initial years due to poor planning and market analysis. He discussed various schemes offered by the MSME to promote startups in India. The audiences' morale was boosted up by outshining various examples of leading startups like Uber, Britannia, OYO, Medicine companies, Maruti, Aashirvaad and many more who supported the fact that new set up businesses should be kicked off with trading rather than manufacturing.

Session 2 Day 2 was taken up by Mr. HP Singh, Chief Consultant in National Institute for Entrepreneurship & Small Business Development, Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Govt. of India. He had a very innovative and creative way of elucidating the concepts of invention, innovation and skill, through story lines, case studies and PowerPoint presentations. He gave instances of many high flyers entrepreneurs and their inspiring success stories.

The event headed up to the third day where we had Professor Vinod Kumar as our resource person. He is a former General Manager in Marketing at Bharat Electronics Ltd. (BEL), and a visiting professor at JIMS and NMIMS. His discussion with the participants forced them to think out of the box. He discussed the startups initiated in 2019 who grabbed the opportunities and bought unique solutions to general problems just like Paytm. He enlightened that every time entrepreneurs should assess everything at the moment, they step outside including problems faced by people, how it can be solved, how can people do it better and also competitive analysis of the market should never be neglected.

The session 2 of day 3 was taken up by Ms. Uzma Mumtaz who is an entrepreneurship mentor in the Incubation Department at National Small Scale Industries Corporation. She started with the entrepreneurial support system and its ecosystem. She made participant's mindset clear to never search customers for



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your product rather always search a product for your customers. The product should be decided earliest and then market segmentation is to be done for the customers according to their needs and packaging is based on the classes of customers.

We had Dr. Suman Dhawan, Deputy Director (Academic/WCSC), Department of Technical Education and Training, Government of NCT of Delhi. On Day 4 session 1. Dr. Suman voiced her thoughts on what all hindrances may come in the way while an individual plans to start his own business inclusive of risk bearing, peer pressure, ground working and much more. She focused on the MSME grants that help young and budding entrepreneurs by giving a head start and being their helping hand in financial as well as emotional aspects. While focusing on the ever-changing entrepreneurial ecosystem, Dr. Dhawan highlighted how women have been taking charge and shining bright in this ecosystem by sharing a lot of real -life stories with the audience.

The event was headed for the second session of day 4 with Ms. Sudipti Dhawan, Director Dynamisers solutions having specialization in Cyber Security and Artificial Intelligence as our speaker. She guided students with the proper ways of validating an idea. She focussed on how one can have a pool of ideas and focus on them by researching, having one to one conversation with the competitors, talking to elders, taking regular feedback etc.

On day 5 session 1, the discussion was on "The main reasons for startups failure in India" by our speaker Ms. Sudipti Dhawan. Our participants were encouraged to take a step ahead towards their goal without fearing failure because winners are those who grip some risk too. She told the success story of Vijay Shekhar sharma , co- founder and CEO of Paytm which taught the important fact that one should



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consider while failing is 'I have not failed, I've just found 10,000 ways that won't work'.

The second session was conducted by Dr. V.K. Arora, CEO, Incubation Centre Delhi Govt., IGDTUW, Anveshan Foundation. The topic of his session was "Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Business Idea Generation" where he discussed real life examples to explain the terms like innovation and creativity. He laid down the fundamental principle of entrepreneurship that an idea without a solution to the problems is not an entrepreneurial idea. He also talked about "Business Incubators" where he explained how to connect the idea with business incubators and also created awareness among students regarding the number of incubators in Delhi and the way of reaching them.

On Day 6 session 1, we had amongst us Ms. Mamta Prajapati, Sector Expert Food at National Consumer Helpline (Project of Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution). Her session was focussed on the food industry. She apprised participants about the various food businesses that can be undertaken under different domains like packaging, ecommerce, catering etc. Audience was familiarized with the whole process of Registration and Licensing step by step along with that they were told who all needed to register and grab a licence. She stated the key features of the platform FoSCoS and what all things a person requires to login, register for different domains.

Second session of day 6 was taken up by Mr. Nipun Jain, Founder and Business Head, Natty Ninos. A Short term Course on entrepreneurship can't be complete without an entrepreneur himself being a part of it. He narrated his own story starting with how he got the business idea from his experiences, hurdles and ups and downs in the journey and how he overcame those things by recommending to focus on what you want to do, trust yourself, take time to think upon and go with



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the process. He encouraged the participants by asking them to explore and not to restrict themselves within the 4 walls.

Day 7 session 1 was taken up by Mr. Ravindra Nath, Ex Chairman and Managing Director, National Small industries corporation (NSIC). Some life changing short movies were recommended to the participants which can open up their mind sets in various aspects. He focussed mainly on gaining practical skills rather than theoretical learning. He also apprised the participants with many schemes like 'Aspire', 'Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Yojna' and WEP i.e Women Entrepreneurs' Platform which is established specially for women. Second speaker of the day 7 was Mr. Pushpendra Kumar, Associate professor, Kirorimal College, DU. He enunciated about the skills that need to be inculcated in every student so that they can chase their path towards a job provider. He stimulated participants with his known mate's success story which left an inspirational mark in their minds. He unfolded the success stories of Ebay, Coca Cola, Pepsi and many more leading companies who are now touching the heights of success in their own fields.

Also, we conducted one activity on Presenting a Business Plan on Day 7, where Participants formed groups and presented their business ideas. The competition was judged by Dr. Sharda Garg, Ms, Rashmi Singh and Ms. Priya, from department of commerce, MSC. Participants were judged on the basis of Innovation, creativity, viability of the generation of funds, approach to target markets and team coordination.

Day 8 session 1 was taken up by Mr. Tripat Preet Singh. He commenced the session on topic 'Funding and related Concepts'. He tried to provide a right path to students by quoting that "Funding may or may not happen, it is not a roadblock for you to do a business." Later, the second session was conducted by Mr. Anurag



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Mittal who addressed queries of participants related to entrepreneurship. The way he took all the doubts was remarkable.



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20. Faculty Development Program: Teacher, Teaching and Teacher Education: Processes, Concerns and Prospects

(18-23 October, 2020)

The six days online Faculty Development Programme (FDP) from 18-23 October, 2020 organised by Department of Elementary Education and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Mata Sundri College for Women, University of Delhi and for Social Science, Dr. Harsingh Gour Teaching Learning Centre Vishwavidyalaya, Sagar (DHGVV, Sagar), Madhya Pradesh (under the aegis of Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching, Ministry of Education), marked another attempt to build an academic discourse around the New Education Policy, 2020. The FDP had its thematic focus on teachers, teaching and teacher education as envisaged in the policy perspective. The support of its patrons Prof. Harpreet Kaur, Principal, Mata Sundri College and Prof. Janak Dulari Ahi, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Dr. Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya, Madhya Pradesh and, and the concerted efforts by Dr. Ravneet Kaur, (Coordinator, FDP, Mata Sundri College), Dr. Lokesh (Coordinator, IQAC, Mata Sundri College) Dr. Sanjay (Convener, FDP, DHGVV, Sagar) and Dr. Afreen (Coordinator, FDP, DHGVV, Sagar) ensured the successful completion of the FDP.

On exploring the NEP 2020 document in context of the given theme, it was realised that the policy as it reads, commits itself to structural, pedagogical, curricular and infrastructural changes at various levels of education. In laying out specific measures through which these changes will be accomplished, the policy document envisions the role of the teachers in this process as crucial. However, while the role of the teachers as agents of transformation has been long recognised, gaps continue to exist in ensuring quality preparation, employment and



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service conditions of these agents of change. There is a dire need of enforcing the standards for quality in each of these aspects so as to empower teachers. The NEP, 2020 recognises this and proposes changes in teacher preparation, recruitment process and service conditions. Among the many proposals, introduction of a 4-year integrated B. Ed. Degrees offering a dual specialization in both Education and a second discipline has been a major step towards revamping teacher education in the country. But like for other changes, this too creates opportunities and brings new challenges within itself. Therefore the need to analyse and assess the policy's vision for the teacher and teacher education, thus becomes pressing. It is in the view of these concerns and convictions that the present FDP was planned on the given theme which was further explored with more than 20 sessions where resource persons with expertise in their fields interacted with the participants. These experts were prominent personalities from some of the most prominent institutions of the country like National Sanskrit Foundation, Department of Education. Delhi University, Mahatma Gandhi Antarrashtriva Hindi Vishwavidyalaya, Wardha, Maulana Azad National Urdu University Hyderabad, University, Amritsar, Ambedkar University Delhi, Banaras Hindu GND University, IGNOU, NCTE to name a few and many others from premier national and international institutes and organizations.

The FDP saw mass response with more than 250 registrations. It's a matter of pride that the organisers were not only able to reach out to participants across the expanse of the country; the urban, semi -urban and rural belts, but also from our neighbouring country Nepal. The FDP is joined by participants affiliated to many central universities, state universities. private

universities and institutions, from located across different states and union territories. The participants represent a diverse cohort of disciplines and research interests. This is very significant in terms of taking the discourse and deliberations



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that emerged in this FDP further and will contribute to larger discourses both at national and international level that are happening in the area of teacher education.

The various sub-themes through which the programme unfolded concerned a number of dimensions of teacher and teacher education. These encompassed understanding the ways in which the role of the teacher and the expectations from him/ her have been envisaged through ancient philosophies and in the contemporary policy documents, exploring the changes in the curriculum and pedagogy of teacher education programmes to incorporate the understanding of sustainable development goals, deliberating on the major challenges in the implementation suggested for teacher education, and reflecting on the re-envisioned structure of schooling as recommended by the National Education Policy 2020. There was an attempt to weave an interdisciplinary understanding, through perspectives building on different strands of teacher education, whether they emerge from the disciplines of Education or Liberal subjects.

Each day of the programme brought with itself insights about different dimensions. The resource persons engaged the participants in reflection and critical appraisal of a number of aspects of pedagogy, classroom environment, inclusion and many more. Aspects like flipped learning in classrooms, implications and challenges of digital education, changing contours of classroom space and time, issues of self and identity of a teacher, implications for the process of education, notions of learning and disabilities, cultural and civilizational understanding of teacher and learner, child-centred pedagogy, autonomy and agency of teacher and their professional development, processes, methods and means of assessment and evaluation and many more were dealt with. The list is not exhaustive.

Other than providing questions for reflections, the six days of the online FDP was a platform to analyse the strengths and limitations in the NEP 2020. This exercise



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of detailed discussions is a crucial step forward to identify the incongruities and challenges, and explore further the possibilities and suggestions for a successful ground realisation of the policy in its true sense. Open discussions towards the end of each session, provided opportunities to the participants to raise questions, concerns and express their views. This proved crucial for the sharing of ideas and suggestions, and building dialogue between the speaker and the participants. Involvement of the participants was secured by giving some an opportunity to moderate the sessions and contribute in the conduction of the FDP. The comments, questions and feedback on the FDP is a valuable source of public knowledge and also provides immense scope for improvement. Apart from the apparent learning in terms of session-discussions and participation, for its organisers, this was a great exercise in team building, cooperation, critical and creative thinking. decision making and crisis management. At every step from its conceptualization, to planning and execution there was something new to enhance one's life skills. It is this kind of experience that proves to be a milestone in the process of lifelong learning.

The course commenced on 31st October 2020 with an inaugural ceremony which began with a melodious rendition of the college prayer. The objective of the course was specifically to introduce various concepts of Python programming which would enable the participants to gain basic understanding of the tools and techniques involved in Data Sciences while



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providing exposure to different applications of Python through projects such as sentiment analysis, detection of fake news etc. Several useful topics like Python Data Structures, Python Programming Fundamentals, NumPy, Pandas and Matplotlib, Introduction to Machine Learning (ML) were covered. Students created python scripts and worked on the data-sets to apply ML. The Instructor interacted with the students on a one-to-one basis and took their doubts in each session. 6 assessments and a final test were taken during the course to strengthen their knowledge of the Python language.

The live sessions concluded on 22nd November 2020 with a closing ceremony where the TIC, Ms. Mandeep Walia and the Course Coordinator Ms. Sonia Aneja proposed a vote of thanks and some of the participants shared their experiences and feedback of the course. The students participated in full enthusiasm and found the course beneficial and interesting. Successful students were given E-Certificates at the end of the course.

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22. Short-Term Certificate Course on Gender Studies

A 30 hour online short term course was organized by the Department of Political Science and IQAC, Mata Sundri College for Women, Delhi University in collaboration with Forum for Democracy from 1st November, 2020 to 13th November, 2020. The course was conducted through online mode and it has been designed keeping in mind multiple aspects of comparative study, new perspectives, scholarly engagements, strategic evaluation methods, assessment techniques and case study method among many other innovative approaches. The course was enrolled by 99 students and 77 students successfully completed the The course was holistically designed for undergraduate students. It course. encompasses an interdisciplinary framework that enables the learner to seek answers to critical questions pertaining to gender and its associated fraternities. The key purpose of this certificate course was to acquaint the participants with crucial aspects, interrogations, inquiries and debates intertwining the subject. The Gender Studies program will provide both historical and contemporary perspectives on myriad social, economic and political aspects. The course curriculum enunciated on a multilayered and multidisciplinary framework encompassing disciplines of law, history, economics, psychology, sociology, philosophy, political science and literature among many others. The aim was to empower the learner with the ability to examine socio-economic, political, psychological as well as cultural conundrum about gender. This course applied a method of integrative learning that was facilitated through training and lectures imparted by academicians, practitioners, common voices, representatives of different sectors as well as advanced level of student participation. The goal was also to enhance awareness of current as well as lived experiences around gender, and of the numerous intersectional attributes of gender with other social identities and political standpoints. In the inauguration of the course, the Patron of the



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course Prof.Harpreet Kaur gave the welcome address. She spoke about gender, feminism and intersectional approaches and analysed how women, men and children in different kinds of family's experience privilege and marginalization in private and public contexts based on their gender, race, social class, sexual and gender orientations and nationality, among other forms of stratification. She expressed her belief that women bear the double burden of paid work and unpaid care work and a rights-based approach can help them protect them from violence and exclusion. She congratulated all the students who joined this course and wished them good luck. The Chief Guest for the event was Dr.Garima Tiwari(ACP). She shared her personal experience related to the subject Gender. She spoke about gender-based violence which is not just physical, but also emotional and psychological. With the changing times, digital platforms are now also being used for such violence. She stressed that we all should protect our self-respect and also learn to draw a line. She believes that there is an urgent need for all of us to rethink and re-imagine the gendered connotations of the Human Rights framework. During the course work academicians, social activists, lawyers, professionals and a myriad of intellectuals conducted the sessions. All the sessions were attended enthusiastically not only by the students but also our faculty members. Students have shown exceptional participation with their intriguing questions and proactive participation. The resources for the course appreciated the way students participated in the class. There were guizzes and assignments conducted for the assessment of the students. The students were given completion certificates on the basis of their attendance, guizzes and assignments. At the end of the 30 hour course, a closing ceremony was also conducted. The ceremony was graced by Ms. Neliswa Nkani, Head, South Africa Tourism as Chief Guest

Department of Computer Science and IQAC, Mata Sundri College for Women, University of Delhi, initiated the 30-hours online short term course on "Graphics Designing & Front-End Web Development" in collaboration with GirlScript Foundation, on 2nd January 2021. The department supports, engages and assists students in active learning for technical and creative capabilities of each student. Besides regular courses, the department regularly organizes various courses and events periodically for the benefit of students. These courses are able to offer students better chances of PG admissions, internships as well as numerous job opportunities.

The course was inaugurated by Dr. Harpreet Kaur, Principal, Mata Sundri College for Women, University of Delhi. The inaugural ceremony commenced at 4.15 pm with the welcome address by Dr Kiranjeet Sethi, TIC Coordinator, Department of Computer Science. She also shared course details and elaborated about Mata Sundri College for Women and GirlScript Foundation. Dr. Harpreet Kaur in her inaugural address motivated the participants to make full utilization of the technical skill-set of the Expert Trainers. Dr Lokesh Kumar Gupta, IQAC Coordinator told about the various initiatives and collaborations taken up by IQAC. He requested participants to utilize their valuable time by sincerely attending all the sessions during the course and provide the daily feedback. Ms Ashema Hasti, Programme Coordinator introduced the three Guest Speakers from GirlScript Foundation, namely, Ms Anubha Maneshwar, Co-Founder, GirlScript Foundation, Mr Dharm Narayan, Community Manager and Ms Tanya Batra, Branding and



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Strategic Manager. They briefed about the training programmes created by their team of experts to help participants build their career and about the community building efforts done by their organization.

The aim of this 30 hours course was to provide students an opportunity to learn high-demand skills of designing attractive web pages and using Graphics tools in creating and enhancing visualization effects. Inclusion of Rigorous, authentic assignments and live projects in the course added value to their skill set. The highlight of the course was hands-on training to participants by Subject Matter Experts from the industry in the area. The workshop was divided into ten technical sessions of three hours each, followed by online assessment of the students. There were five sessions each on graphics designing and Front End Web development. The course was conducted entirely in online mode, after college hours and on weekends, using the Online Platform of CISCO WEBEX. The course material was provided in the electronic format along with the Session Recordings.

The Resource persons for the course were Mr Saurabh Mali, Graphics Designer and Mr Keshav Singh, Web Designer. Students learnt how to install the Adobe Photoshop & Illustrator tools. During the Graphics Designing Sessions, the learning was multifaceted including theoretical, conceptual and project-based learning with options to explore the functional, technical, and planning aspects, along with the stylistic, aesthetic, and thematic elements of Design. Exposure to practical websites and live project work was also given to the students along during the sessions and students

were taught about portfolios, illustrations, logos, motion designing and creating gif images and how to create their own ecommerce website. Students created two projects: Mini version of the website on SkateBoard Community and E-Bookstore app. During the Sessions on Front-end Development, students learnt about HTML,



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CSS, JavaScript and ReactJS. The instructor taught the

basics of web development and helped the students to install VS Code and GitHub along with the NodeJS software. He described and differentiated the meaning of two important concepts: "Git" and "GitHub". Further, the students learnt to make a repository in GitHub and then worked upon its various commands such as git push, git clone, git status, git remove rm origin, git remote add origin, git log, etc. Students worked on three Web development projects: Building Portfolio, creating StopWatch and Tic Tac Toe game.

Students had the opportunity to put together their skills in the projects designed and created by them which provided an opportunity to them to ideate the concepts, implement the same and carry it to completion. The course saw an enrolment of 50 participants from various colleges of University of Delhi, including Keshav Mahavidyalaya, Deshbandhu College, IP College for Women, St Stephens College, SPM College for Women, Ram Lal Anand and Mata Sundri College for Women. The speaker interacted with the students on a one-to-one basis and provided them with valuable tips. The students found the sessions beneficial and interesting as the Instructors shared their immense knowledge and expertise on the topic in an elaborate yet simple manner. Students were provided E Certificates at the end of the course, based on their completed projects and online assessment, conducted on 2nd February, 2021.

The Valedictory session was held on 5th Feb 2021 from 4pm onwards and was graced by the presence of Dr. Kiranjeet Sethi, TIC Coordinator and Dr Lokesh Kumar Gupta, IQAC Coordinator, who appreciated the efforts of the organizing team and enthusiasm of participants. The Co-Founder and Managing Director of GirlScript Foundation Mr Mohit Varu and Programme Coordinator Mr Chinmay Mokhare expressed their gladness in collaborating with our college. 

The course included assignments & presentations (10 marks), Quiz (30 marks) and a written examination (60 marks) at the end of the course for the proper evaluation of the students.


A 10 hour optional practical project was also discussed in the course which was the Neem school project under the guidance of Anjali ma'am for which interested students could apply.

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

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

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29. PROFESSIONAL ETHICS: THEORY AND PRACTICE

DEPARTMENT OF PHILOSOPHY(ASTITVA), MATA SUNDRI COLLEGE FOR WOMEN, ORGANISED AN INTERDISCIPLINARY NATIONAL CONFERENCE ON THE TOPIC: PROFESSIONAL ETHICS: THEORY AND PRACTICE, ON 21ST AND 22ND JANUARY 2020. IT WAS SPONSORED BY INDIAN COUNCIL OF PHILOSOPHICAL RESEARCH, MHRD, NEW DELHI. THE CONFERENCE HAD IN ATTENDANCE, MANY EMINENT SPEAKERS. THE INVITED SPEAKERS GAVE TALKS ON MANY IMPORTANT TOPICS INCLUDING BUT NOT RESTRICTED TO: MEDICAL ETHICS, SPORTS ETHICS, MILITARY ETHICS ETC.

THE CONFERENCE WAS DIVIDED INTO NINE SESSIONS COUNTING TWO PARALLEL SESSIONS FOR PAPER PRESENTATIONS. THIS ALLOWED THE AUDIENCE THE OPPORTUNITY TO GRASP AND UNDERSTAND MANY INTERESTING TOPICS IN A SHORT PERIOD.

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Day 1:- 21ST JANUARY 2020

Inaugural Session

Rapporteur: Menka Ahlawat (Dept. of English, MSCW)

Day one of the two-day interdisciplinary National Conference on 'Professional Ethics: Theory and Practice' organized by the Department of Philosophy, Mata Sundri College for Women, Delhi University, commenced on 21st January, 2020 in the Mata Sahib Kaur Auditorium. The Conference began on a high note with the



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college prayer invoking divine blessings on the program. The anchor of the session, Dr. Kiranjit Sethi, then invited the dignitaries and guests to light the lamp. Respected Principal of the college Prof. (Dr.) Harpreet Kaur Jaswal extended a warm welcome to the Chief Guest of the program Prof. (Dr.) Bhushan Patwardhan (Vice-chairman, UGC, New Delhi), keynote speaker Prof. (Dr.) R.C. Sinha (Chairman, ICPR, New Delhi), guest of honour Mr. Earnest Rwamucyo (High Commissioner, Rwanda)'s representative Mr. Joseph Kabakeza (Deputy High Rwanda), distinguished guest Prof. (Dr.) Balaganapathi Commissioner, Devarakonda (HoD, Department of Philosophy, Delhi University) and Prof. (Dr.) Mrs. Vibha Chaturvedi (former Head of Department, Department of Philosophy, Delhi University) by presenting them with plants and mementoes. The Convener of the Conference Dr. Lakshmi Vats (Teacher-in-charge, Department of Philosophy, Mata Sundri College for Women) welcomed the Principal and distinguished guest Sardar Harindar Pal Singh (member, College Governing Body) by felicitating them with the same.

The welcome was followed by the release of the souvenir of the Conference in the esteemed presence of the dignitaries. The convener of the Conference then proceeded to address the gathering which comprised of teachers and students of the college and those of other Delhi University Colleges.

Prof. (Dr.) Harpreet Kaur, in her Welcome address, welcomed everyone and harkened back to the principles of the Guru Granth Sahib as guiding principles to an ethical life. She highlighted the need to balance corporate values with human rights and environmental concerns. Subsequent to this, Prof. (Dr.) Bhushan Patwardhan congratulated the College and the Department of Philosophy especially, for organizing the Conference, stressing its significance for a young generation readying themselves to enter the workforce. Prof. (Dr.) R.C. Sinha encouraged the participants to steer the discussion of professional ethics in a



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productive direction by reminding them that in a post-modern world, values must be pluralistic and relative, rather than absolute. As a diplomat, Mr. Joseph Kabakeza discussed professional ethics in the context of a career in diplomacy. He discussed the creative challenges of representing one's nation in a foreign land and the importance of a set of rules and guidelines in this task, encouraging students to develop sensitivity. Sardar 3

H.P. Singh brought religious ethics into conversation by raising pertinent questions about the loss of spiritual –ethical values in the age of crude materialism and artificial intelligence. He linked ethical education with an equitable national economy and holistic social development. Prof. (Dr.) Balaganapathi Devarakonda encouraged the participants of the Conference to think beyond the traditional while discussing professional ethics. He said that professionals are no longer watertight compartments but have diversified and proliferated in recent years, which demands a redefining of the field of ethics in professions, in such Conferences. Prof. (Dr.) Vibha Chaturvedi helped to conclude the session on a positive note by appreciating its practical relevance to students, teachers and professionals, and she wished them good luck for the Conference. Dr. Lakshmi Vats thanked the speakers for their addresses and the session came to a conclusion by breaking for tea.

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Day 1:- 21ST JANUARY 2020

Plenary session: 1

Rapporteur: Avantika Pokhriyal (Dept. of English, MSCW)



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The first session of the National Conference on 'Professional Ethics: Theory and Practice' began with a welcome note by Dr. Pooja Wadhawan of Mata Sundri College. The session was chaired by Professor Vibha Chaturvedi (Former Head, Department of Philosophy, DU). Dr. Lakshmi Vats and Dr. Garima Mani Tripathi welcomed the speakers by presenting them with mementos.

The first speaker of the session was Professor Balaganapathi Devarakonda (Head, Department of Philosophy, DU). He addressed the disappearance of philosophy from the public sphere, public epistemology. He stressed on the need for academia to make the discipline more accessible to the masses. While touching upon the difference between profession and vocation he threw light on the emerging professions within the discipline.

The session moved forward with the second speaker, Professor Suman Khanna(retired) Associate Professor, Mata Sundri College, DU. The topic of her address was "Gandhi's Practice of Satya And Satyagraha". She spoke about the pivotal importance of Truth in life as well as the politics of Gandhi. His philosophy was based on the ideals of satyagraha. Truth, for Gandhi, was both the means and ends. For him, non-violence was a science through which he mobilized an entire nation. She ended her address by underscoring the importance of Gandhian philosophy in the present times and the continued relevance of non-violent protests (Satyagraha). In the 21st century.

The third speaker Dr. Yatish Sharma, Discussed Medical Ethics which guide the decision making of a doctor when treating patients. The Medical Ethics are governed by the following tenets

- 1) Autonomy (of the patient who has the right to accept or reject the treatment being offered by his/her doctor),
- 2) Confidentiality



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3) Beneficence

4) Justice

Some other medical ethics include Proportionality and Veracity. Dr. Sharma then touched upon the history of the evolution of medical ethics from Hippocrates to the Geneva Convention.

The session was brought to a close by the final address of the chairperson, Prof. Vibha Chaturvedi. She stressed on the importance of Truth and Integrity as universal ethics

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which are common to all professions, irrespective of professional differences. She further added that the need of the hour is to incorporate the ethics of striving towards excellence in all professional endeavours.

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Day 1:- 21st JANUARY 2020

Plenary session: 2

Rapporteur: Meenu Chaudhary (Dept. of English, MSCW)

The session started by welcoming and felicitating Dr. Yatish Sharma, Dr. Vaihali Dhingra and Dr. M.P. Singh. Dr. Yatish Sharma Chaired the Session.

Dr. Dhingra shared her wisdom and experience on Corporate Ethics as well as on model Business Principles. She mentioned that it is important to analyze one's means of growth for sustainable development and for maintaining public health standards. She gave pertinent examples like the killing of the tribals regarding the Vedanta mining (for its bauxite mining) an anti-environment initiative. Another



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principle mentioned was the land acquisition model, for building special economic zones (SEZ). Through the examples of Singur Tata Nano Controversy, Monsanto's seed of suicide and Viharbha farmer suicide, she highlighted the misgivings that occur, in the absence of ethical business practices. The Corporate houses should say absolute no to child labour, any form of discrimination and build on the quality of work life.

Dr. MP Singh discussed traditions of philosophy: Sophists, Socratic and so on. He defined the concepts of professionalism and professional ethics. His speech touched around the need for a mutually beneficial employee-employer relationship. He concluded by emphasizing the need for professional ethics in the contemporary world.

Lastly, Dr. Yatish Sharma summed up the session by highlighting the key features of the session. The Principal, Dr. Harpreet Kaur Shared her wise words and appreciated both the teachers and students for their hard work. 7

Day 1:- 21ST JANUARY 2020

Parallel session: 1

Rapporteur: (Dept. of English, MSCW)

The paper presentation was chaired by Dr. Jasjit Kaur, Senior Associate Professor, Department of Political Science, MSCW. The session was co-chaired by Dr. Rekha Navneet, Associate Professor, Department of Philosophy, University of Delhi. The papers were presented by Undergraduate students and Research Scholars from different academic institutions. The presenters touched on varied issues related to ethics like abortion, ethics in daily life, media ethics, ethics in business and



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military etc.

There were a total of fourteen papers presented on day 1. The topics presented were varied and diverse in the field of focus. Even then, the presenters all emphasized the need for ethics especially in the contemporary world.

Interesting perspectives were provided for the debate on abortion and how government sanctioned safe abortion laws and better sex education could reduce the risk of unwanted pregnancies.

A paper on the role ethics plays in making us moral, raised questions on intrinsic and coercion-based morality.

The papers on media ethics helped highlight the dissonance between real news and sensationalism and how journalistic ethics have compromised.

In her concluding remarks, the Chair Dr. Jaskit Kaur said that she was impressed by the array of papers presented. She felt that the paper presenters were successful in putting their points forward and wished them luck for future endeavors. 8

Day 2:- 22nd JANUARY 2020

Plenary session: 3

Rapporteur: Dr. Ishpreet Virdh & Ms. Manjot Kaur (Department of Commerce)

Day 2 of the Interdisciplinary National Conference on Professional Ethics Theory and Practice organized by the Department of Philosophy, Mata Sundri College for Women, University of Delhi began with Plenary Session 3. This session was Chaired by Prof. (Dr.) Jata Shankar, professor, Department of Philosophy,



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University of Allahabad. He enlightened on the topic: Classical Indian Perspective. He emphasized on practicing ethically whatever we know and learning from our mistakes. According to him, Professional Ethics is a part of Applied Ethics. He introduced the concept Meta Ethics which is related to 'dharma', religion. He concluded with the qualities of a good teacher.

The first speaker of the session, Prof.(Dr.) Ritu Gaur, Faculty of Life Sciences and Biotechnology, South Asian University, New Delhi. She elaborated on the topic: Professional Ethics and Academics. She talked about the responsibilities of academicians towards students, colleagues, parents and community. She also emphasized on the need to maintain ethical standards. She concluded by briefing about plagiarism and ways to avoid it.

The second speaker of the session was Mr. Manish Mudgal, Founder and Coach, Academy of Language and Learning. He addressed the audience on the topic: Professional Ethics in Teaching He discussed core ethical areas in teaching- (a) Knowledge, (b) Integrity, (c) Kindness, (d) Courage, (e) Scientific temper. He elaborated on the difference between information and knowledge as a path to holistic success.

The enlightening session came to an end with a vote of thanks. 9

Day 2:- 22nd JANUARY 2020

Plenary session: 4

Rapporteur: Dr. Paromita (Department of English)

This session of the conference focused on the evolution of Ethics in various fields. What role does it play? It was emphasized that ethics is important not only in the



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conduct of research work but also in everyday life.

Ethics has become an integral part of various professional be it – medical, sports, law and many more. The speakers during the course of this session highlighted the need and importance of research ethics and how it is interwoven with the principles and values of accountability informed decision.

Prof Dr Deepak Gaur: Principles and practices of research ethics

Prof Gaur, the first speaker highlighted how ethics is related with moral principles and acceptable and non- acceptable behavior. He explained how medical practices have evolved and made ethics an important and essential part of research work.

It was explained through various examples that what was prevalent in earlier times will not be acceptable as the proper way of conducting research. The principles and regulations as we understand today did not exist before.

The little Albert Experiment (1920) and the Nuremberg Trial in the post second world war period focused on the ethical code of conduct and laid the foundation of Basis of Research Ethics. The Nuremberg code stated that if the research subject is human then the consent of the person involved is required.

Further Dr Gaur enumerated various examples like the experiments on non whites in America which highlighted how medical research did not consider the individual need or consent.

Lastly, Dr Gaur emphasized on the importance of human protection if he's a subject in a research and how data needs to be protected and collected according to the rules and regulations. Acknowledgement, confidentiality must be maintained during and after research.



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Dr Sandeep Tiwari – sports ethics

Dr Tiwari enumerated how doping scandals or issues undermine the integrity of sports and sports people. There is a need for a clean sports culture. There have been many examples over the years which has raised the question of sports ethics. It was further

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highlighted that sports people need to follow certain rules and practice such standards that do not question the integrity of the sports.

Dr Tiwari explained 6 principle that every sport person should follow : 1) Trustworthiness

2) Respect

3) Responsibility

4) Fairness

5) Good citizenship

6) Caring

Lastly, ethical conduct also includes discrimination on the basis of race, gender, etc. Prof Dr Usha Tandon – legal ethics Ethics in legal profession

Prof Tandon highlighted why legal ethics is important for the society and lawyers. Lawyers are responsible for maintaining the honor and dignity of the law profession. Conduct of legal professionals not only affects the individual but also the administration of justice which is the foundation of civilized society. It is



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imperative that the confidence of the people in the legal profession be maintained.

The Bar Council of India has the authority to decide on the rules with regard to the conduct of the lawyers.

Chairperson ,Prof Dr S.C. Sharma

Prof Sharma in his remarks highlights the role of ethics and how individuals in various capacities impact this. Teachers must carry his behavior so that the students can learn the code of conduct or people behavior which is based on the moral principles. Prof Sharma gave importance to the teaching of Guru Nanak Dev Ji as great heritage with regard to the understanding of human nature.

No dimension of life is untouched by ethics and teachers have a great responsibility towards generating the awareness regarding it amongst the students.

Sardar Harinder Pal Singh – Member governing body Harinder Pal Ji highlighted the importance of values and ethics in the society and why it is important for the youth to understand it.

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Day 2:- 22nd JANUARY 2020

Plenary session: 5

Rapporteur: Panchali Devi (Department of English)

The Plenary Session 5 of the Inter-disciplinary National Conference on "Professional Ethics: Theory and Practice" titled 'Military Ethics' started with felicitation of the speakers- Major General (Rtd.) Sanjay Soi and Captain SB Tyagi.

Major General (Rtd.) Sanjay Soi started his lecture with a brief documentary on



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Indian Army. He highlighted the core ethics of honour, discipline, integrity, loyalty, courage, duty and respect, sense of sacrifice, patriotism, selfless service and values in Indian Armed Forces. He emphasized on the commitment to these ideals by the members of the armed forces in their professional as well as personal lives. He gave an insight into the ethics building process in the armed forces. He stressed on the centrality of trust amongst the armed personnel of the organization. He also clearly pointed out the loyalty of the Indian army towards the constitution of India. Major General (Rtd.) Sanjay Soi highlighted the fact that the Indian Army is deeply guided by the ethic of human rights.

Captain (Rtd.) SB Tyagi in his lecture titled 'War, Warfare and Prisoners of War: Role of Ethics' discussed how war is inevitable in human society but they are to be fought with ethics. The main thrust of his lecture was how prisoners of war are to be treated ethically in this context. He cited examples from the ancient period as well as contemporary times. He emphasized the fact that the Indian Army strictly follows the Geneva Convention protocols in treating prisoners of war. He gave examples of the Bangladesh war when 91000 prisoners of war were treated with humanity by the Indian army. On the other hand, he emphatically stressed on the fact how some countries like Pakistan have no regard for the Geneva Convention protocols in treating prisoners of war.

Day 2:- 22nd JANUARY 2020

Parallel session: 2

Rapporteur: Suman (Department of History)

The paper presentation was chaired by Dr. Ajay Verma, Associate Professor, Department of Philosophy, JNU and co-chaired by Dr. Radhika Menon, Associate



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Professor, Department of Education, Mata Sundri College. The papers were presented by Research Scholars from different academic institutions. The presenters touched on varied issues related to ethics like paternalism, consent, euthanasia, fear-based morality, technology, to still relevant topics like Bhagwat Gita and Gandhi.

The session began with paper presentation by Dr. Afzal Ahmad whose topic was 'Concept of Person in Abortion Debate'. He talked about what constitutes a person and when personhood begins. He raised the issue of feotus being a potential person and debate around it.

Alson Joseph presented a paper on "An Ethical Study on Distinction with Morality and Human Values". He raised the issue of morality and how it was different from human values. He focused on Thomas Hobbes and the concept of state of nature.

Ekta Bhati's paper was on the topic "A Study of Gandhi's Practices of Exemplary Ethics in Conflict Resolutions". She discussed how non-violence can enable one to resolve conflicts both social and personal. How non-violence helps in substantiating peace.

Anshika Srivastava's topic of presentation was 'Ethics in Education: a reflection on the case of Indian School'. She looked into curriculum related policy documents and through this, how ethics have informed curricular construction in India.

Jenia Kakchingtabam's topic was 'Anatomy and Consent in Medical Ethics'. She spoke on the significance of autonomous choice of a person/patient in medical ethics.

Lizashree Hazarika spoke on the topic 'Critical Outlook of Paternalistic Motivations in Medical Professions'. She looked into the issue of paternalism in the medical profession.



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Megha Kapoor's topic 'An Ethical Basis of Industry 4.0'. It deals with technologies that have given a boost to business but raised questions of ethics there.

Aradhana Gupta's topic was 'What Drives Us to Be Moral: Fear or Love'. She discussed that religion and law are major stimulants for ethics.

Dr. Sabina S presented her paper 'An Analysis On The Biopolitics Of Prenatal Testing', raising the issue of the use of ultrasound.13

Dr. Richa Kapoor Mehra's topic 'Ethics of Bhagwat Gita' focused on its teaching.

Shami Ulla's topic was 'What Disconfirms a Deductive Model of Ethical Applications'. He raised the issue of euthanasia

Sangeeta Pathak spoke on 'Students Perspective Of Ethical Use Of Information Technologies'. She viewed issues and challenges faced by students (plagiarism and piracy).

The session was wrapped up concluding remarks of Dr. Radhika Menon who touched concisely on all issues discussed by paper presenters. Finally, the chair Dr. Ajay Verma thanked and congratulated the presenters for presenting such well researched topics. He said platform exclusively should be provided to researchers and students to present papers with sufficient time. 14

In her speech, Dr. Kaur talked about various disciplines, which flourished with the help of ethics. Alluding to past experiences, she talked about the importance of ethics. She mentioned topics like Righteous Warfare, Righteous Talk and Sikhism. She talked about the Bangladesh Warfare where women were upfront. She concluded by saying that malpractices result in failure only.

To present the Valedictory Address, Air Marshal (Retd.) Jagjeet Singh was then called upon to share his wisdom. He shared that he was feeling nostalgic about his service days, having just heard the talks on military ethics. He served the Indian Air Force as an Aeronautical Engineer for over 31 years. He advised the audience that ambition in life should be to select a line, focus on that and work hard to achieve that aim. When someone feels that they are deviating from the path then ethics should come into picture. Each National Defense Academy has a code – "I will not lie, cheat or steal; I will not deceive". No profession is unethical. External forces make you unethical. Wrong is always wrong even if everyone is doing it. He compared his life in the Army to a life cycle. He urged the audience to follow an ethical lifestyle, as that will allow for your name to be carved in history.How can it be achieved? His advice for the audience is to prioritize work, time management, make to-do lists, make role models, and practice self-discipline.

The distinguished guest, Prof. (Dr.) Shashi Prabha Kumar congratulated everybody. She elaborated on the topic: Ethics of family. She categorized it into three: Samanya (universal), Vishesh (Professional) and Varna. Indian System is



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Varna Dharma (ethics of social well-being) that have 4 categories: (1) Brahmins (2) Shatriya (3) Vaishyas (4) Shudras. Indian ethical thoughts try to make noble citizens, not only in theory but in practice. Family is where others are considered above self. Kunti encouraged her sons to fight when necessary. Dharma/Kartavya/Ethics: act accordingly to the way you want to be treated.

At the conclusion of the event, Dr. Lakshmi Vatsa. Teacher in Charge, Department of Philosophy, Mata Sundri College presented a vote of thanks, leaving none and thanking all. With the National anthem, the event came to a close.



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

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

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36. International Webinar: 'Experiences of 'Engaging with Diverse Communities and Key Leanings'

Convener & Moderator: Dr. Garima Kumar (Dept. of Psychology)

The IQAC, MSC organized an International Webinar on Experiences of 'Engaging' with Diverse Communities and Key Leanings'. The Principal Prof.(Dr.) Harpreet Kaur welcomed the panellists and shared her observations on the topic after introductory remarks by Coordinator IQAC Dr. Manisha Mathur. The panellists, Ms Surpreet Cheema (Registered Psychologist with Australian & New Zealand Board) and Ms. Vinita Satija (Mental and Public Health Professional, India), two professional with firsthand experience of working with diverse communities at the grass root level, responded to a number of questions and concerns raised by Moderator and Convener, Dr. Garima Kumar, who highlighted the need for engaging with communities as a third important pillar of higher education in the new curriculum framework, apart from teaching and research. Pertinent issues develop an effective approach to engaging with discussed were; how to communities?; what strategies are needed to enhance participation?, how can evaluation mechanisms be made robust? How can community engagement be a mutually beneficial process for all, by collectively incorporating diverse perspectives and stories?, how can we remain sensitive to the needs of diverse stakeholders by not just incorporating privileged positions of a dominant few researchers/ practitioners? how can we infuse the spirit of learning and serving in higher education institutions? and more. Sharing real life examples, their dilemmas from the field, the panellists enriched over 170 challenges and participants across different universities of the country with their insightful observations. Some practical steps that emerged from the interaction include:



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- Challenging one's assumptions of understanding of what the "other" party looks like or needs. Accepting that there is much we do not know or understand.
- Institutions of higher education ,-students, academia, administrators and civil society may begin by simply asking community members about their desires or objectives for a partnership and programme, to make all conversations and programme partnerships mutually meaningful.
- Significance of evaluating community perspectives, putting their voices at the centre of conversations on partnerships and incorporate the findings into the program design and development. Maintaining a posture of humility in all we do.

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37. A Webinar on 9th May 2020 entitled "Intellectual Property Rights in Traditional Knowledge and Biodiversity"

The Department of Philosophy and IQAC of Mata Sundri College for Women organised a webinar on 9th May 2020 entitled "Intellectual Property Rights in Traditional Knowledge and Biodiversity". The webinar commenced at 12.30 p.m. with introductory remark made by Dr Manisha Mathur, member of IQAC, which was followed by the welcome address presented by the honourable principal Dr Harpreet Kaur who introduced the esteemed speaker Professor (Dr) Amar Singh, highlighting his eventful career in the field of education and the topic of discussion for the day.

The session was then handed over to the eminent speaker. He began by calling traditional knowledge and biodiversity rich economic resources and delineated on the meaning of traditional knowledge. The speaker then elucidated the denotation of Intellectual Property Rights and its importance in the field of biodiversity, the main tools of IPR being patents, copyrights, trademarks and geographical indications. The tools of IPR are designed to safeguard the interests of the preserving indigenous community.

The discussion then directed towards the regime of IPR that is contingent upon the nature of the economy and varies from one to another namely the capitalist system, the socialist system and the mixed economic system. In the regime, the final aim of the capitalist system is the marketing of IPR for profit making, while in a socialist system, the aim concerns the use of IPR for the benefit of the citizens and safeguard the interest of the primary stakeholders concerned.



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The speaker then discussed the imminent politics of conflict of interest between the holders of traditional knowledge and the prospectors who are involved in commodifying traditional knowledge for the use of the global market. He also outlined the objectives and purposes of global agreements on IPR such as Convention of Biodiversity (CBD) and Trade related aspects of IPR (TRIPS). He provided the audience with an assessment of protection guaranteed under these two initiatives. He also highlighted the practice of countries of global worth who are holding back several pirated patents of Indian traditional knowledge and enumerated some examples like neem oil patent held back by the European patent, turmeric patent held back by the USA patent. The speaker elucidated efforts undertaken by the government of India to document traditional knowledge by creating a Traditional Knowledge Digital Library (TKDL), however, he also highlighted the loopholes of the Indian IPR regime as found in the biodiversity act of 2002 which does not fully safeguard the interests of the indigenous knowledge bearers.

Having emphasised the loopholes, the speaker suggested legal improvements and required administrative action that would ensure the benefit sharing to the indigenous communities. As a conclusion, the speaker aptly noted the moral issues involved in strengthening the IPR regime of India and further the economic benefits that would accrue to the communities as a result of the strengthening of the former.

The session was then followed by the question and answer round moderated by Dr Hemlata Krishnani who prominently took questions of the audience regarding safeguarding the traditional knowledge. The speaker answered the questions while emphasising the idea of kitchen of the houses being a storehouse of tradition knowledge where one can find number of ingredients with medicinal benefits.





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



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42. Report on International Seminar on Pedagogy for a Sustainable World 3rd February, 2020 & International Workshop: Practices and Pedagogies for Sustainability 4th & 5th February, 2020

Report on International Seminar on Pedagogy for a Sustainable World 3rd February, 2020 & International Workshop: Practices and Pedagogies for sustainability 4th & 5th February, 2020 (In collaboration with University of Delhi and Haute école pédagogique, Vaud, Switzerland)

Education for Sustainability has become an important area for teacher education. In order to ensure that teachers are prepared to take on these questions in schools and colleges, the Department for the second year consecutively collaborated with Haute école pédagogique (HEP), Lausanne, Vaud, Switzerland to host a one day seminar and two days of workshop. Students and faculty from India and Switzerland interacted closely during the three days to learn from the practices and methods adopted in the classrooms. The International Seminar held on 3rd February focussed on walks as a pedagogic method and explored conservation practices in order to nurture and sustain heritage.

The keynote address was by historian, author and convenor of Delhi IN-TACH, Dr. Swapna Liddle. The main speaker in the pedagogy session was Professor Anita Rampal, former Dean of Faculty of Education, Delhi University and former Chairperson of NCERT text-book development committee. She highlighted the Cross-Cultural Perspectives in looking at sustainability in textbooks. The seminar was also addressed by Geographer Nadia Lausslet, from HEP, Principal of the college Professor Harpreet Kaur and Convenor of the Seminar and workshop, Dr. Radhika Menon.



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The seminar saw large participation of students, faculty and researchers. Swiss and Indian students deliberated in the seminar on appropriate learning plans for teaching sustainability. A film prepared by the Swiss team as part of the collaboration in 2019 was released on the day.

The International Workshop was held on 4th and 5th February, 2020 and focussed on practices to carry forward sustainability in schools. The second day of the workshop was held at Shaheed Hemu Kalani School. The students of the department, Japsifat Kaur, Harshita Rajput, Ramneek Kaur and Preksha shared their practices as interns in the school. The Principal of the school, Dr BK Sharma addressed the participants of the work-shop on his experiences of working in a public school system and practices needed for turning the school around to a model school. The day's session was processed and facilitated by Dr Radhika Menon, Ms Neha Sharma and Ms Richa Sharma.

The third day of the workshop focussed upon hands on experience of exploring sustainability through heritage. The department students worked with the Swiss students in exploring the UNESCO Heritage Site Humayun's Tomb Complex. Professor Anita Rampal and Ms .Nadia Laussalet, addressed students at the site. A number of faculty participated along with the students.

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47. EMERGING TRENDS IN RESEARCH METHODOLOGY, FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Mata Sundri College for Women in Collaboration with Mahatma Hansraj Faculty Development Center

7-12 October 2019

Consolidated Report

An interdisciplinary, weeklong Faculty Development Programme on *Emerging Trends in Research Methodology* was organized by IQAC Mata Sundri College for Women in collaboration with Mahatma Hansraj Faculty Development Centre from 7-12 October 2019. 75 teachers from all over the country participated in the programme. The aim behind the FDP was to highlight how methodologies and paradigms have changed considerably in the last few years across all disciplines. Research has accompanied humankind since its inception. Holding as constant the intent of enquiry, namely the pursuit of truth, the techniques to uncover the same have altered and evolved over time. The process and product of scientific investigation and enquiry have been shaped by multiple factors; technological leaps and various cultural traditions to name a few. Methodologies and paradigms have changed as have ontology and epistemology. The purpose of the FDP was to show the intersectionalities of seemingly diverse academic fields of knowledge as well as varied research methods and techniques. As a corollary, an initiative to pivot a move directed at evolving methodologies for interdisciplinary enquiry has become imperative. During the FDP, both the Qualitative and Quantitative aspects of research were the focus of attention.

The programme began with the Inaugural Session held on 7th October at 9.30 a.m. in Mata Gujri Hall of the college. The session began with the college prayer and



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was followed by lighting of the lamp by all the dignitaries. Dr. Urmila Devi, Joint Secretary UGC was the chief guest and Prof. K.D. Broota, former head, Department of Psychology was the keynote speaker at this session. The speakers spoke about the importance of research and the points to be kept in mind during the process of research. Further, it was highlighted that research should fulfill certain social objectives. Keeping in view the interdisciplinary nature of the programme a session on Emerging Trends of Research in Social Sciences was organized where Prof. A.S. Narang, former registrar IGNOU spoke about the emerging areas of research in social sciences like Subaltern Studies and Cultural Studies to name a few. A session on Interview Techniques by Prof. Anuradha Bhandari, Punjab University proved to be extremely useful for researchers wishing to collect primary data from the field. The session on New Ways of Doing History: Oral and Visual Histories since 1945 by Dr. Anirudh Deshpande, Department of History, Delhi University focused on how recent research in the discipline of History had shown the importance of oral and visual narratives which could challenge the traditional ways of studying history.

The first session of the second day, 9-10-2019, of the FDP on *Evidence Based Policy Making: Methodological Issues* by Prof. Amitabh Kundu CSRD, JNU looked at the volatility in India's economic growth and how this could be addressed through focusing on structural factors and continuous adjustment in long term policy making. The next speaker Ms. Aparna Bhatia from the Indian Economic Service looked at research from a different perspective, highlighting how a researcher could use government data for research. The extremely interesting session on *Ethnomethodology* by Prof. Shalina Mehta, highlighted how conversations could be used as a research methodology with a special focus on research on tribal communities. The session on *Methodological Issues and Trends in the Study of International Relations* by Dr. Saurabh Mishra, Indian Council of



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World Affairs focused on how various methodologies, Qualitative as well as Quantitative, Discourse Analysis and Grounded Theory could be used while doing research in International Relations.

Keeping in view the interdisciplinary nature of the programme, the first session of 10-10-2019 was devoted to Emerging Trends in Dalit Discourses. The speaker, Prof. Ajmer Singh Kajal from CIL, JNU spoke about Dalit discourse and Dalit literature and the need to empower the community struggling against a system that had kept them enslaved for centuries. The next speaker, Prof. Anita Ghai from Ambedkar University spoke of a marginalization of a different kind with her focus on Qualitative Research in Disability Studies. Prof. Ghai spoke about "emancipatory" research which empowers those who are being researched upon. Moving away from social sciences and literature the next session on Impact of Recent Methodologies in Microbiome Research: Vision for future, introduced the participants to the complex world of microbiomes and the latest research being carried out in the field. The next session on *Emerging Trends of Research in* Finance, by Prof. Yamini Agarwal, Director, IIF Business School (AKTU), Dean (Research) Indian Institute of Finance focused on recent trends of research in finance which could look at different areas such as Pension Finance, Crypto Currency, Bilateral and Multilateral Trade to name a few.

Day four, 11-10-2019 began with an extremely interesting session on *Emerging Research Trends in Sanskrit Literature* by Prof Girish Pant, Jamia Milia Islamia University. Prof. Pant spoke about how literature in Sanskrit was not only written in Ancient India, but continues to be produced even in the 21st century. Prof. Chamanlal, the next speaker of the session *Translation, History and Literature* highlighted the importance of research being done in the area of Translation Studies and underscored the interdependence of literature and history. The session on *Qualitative Research Paradigms* by Prof. Anand Prakash, Dean School of



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Social Sciences looked at changing paradigms of qualitative research in recent times. In the last session on *Methods of Research in Adivasi Literature*, Dr. Ganga Sahay Meena, CIL JNU expressed his views that while researching Adivasi literature one needed to keep preconceived notions at bay. He then went on to highlight various aspects of tribal literature including the importance of oral narratives.

The last day of the FDP, 12-10-2019, began with a session on Emerging Trends in Population Studies with Special Reference to Disability and Ageing by Prof. Bhupinder Zutshi, former registrar, JNU. He began by examining "what is research?", "what is methodology?" and how these can be applied to population The session by Dr. Hemant Dangi, Delhi School of Economics on studies. Business Research looked at various dimensions of business research and was extremely interactive. The next speaker of the day Mr. Nitin Raj from KPMG, speaking on *Big Data and Analytics* talked about the relevance of Data Sciences and Analytics in research and how Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning could help in the analysis of Big Data. The FDP came to a close with the Valedictory Session. Mr. Ashok Arora, advocate Supreme Court was the chief guest on the occasion. Prof. Rama, Principal Hansraj College and Chairperson, MHRFDC was also present at the session. Both the speakers spoke about the role of parents and teachers in a world which was becoming fiercely competitive for children. The function came to an end with Prof. Rama and Mr. Arora distributing certificates to the participants.

48. National Workshop on Sensitizing Disability: Report 15th November 2018.

A National Workshop on "Sensitizing Disability" was organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Mata sundry College for Women in collaboration with the Enabling Unit and NSS on 15th November 2018. Dr. Jagdish Chandra, Associate Professor, Hindu College and Dr. Dyal Singh Panwar, Associate Professor, Lal Bahadur Shastri Sanskrit Vidyapeeth, were speakers at the event. The Workshop began with the College prayer and the traditional lighting of the lamp.

Speaking on the occasion the Principal, Dr. Harpreet Kaur welcomed all the guests and said that disability was a frame of mind that can be overcome by removing barriers. She further emphasized that it was important to sensitize young people about disability in order to create a more just and inclusive society with equal opportunities for all.

The first speaker , Dr. Jagdish Chandra thanked the Principal and the organizing team for hosting the Workshop and began by questioning normative concepts like "normalcy" and "abnormality". He spoke about the need to look at alternative perspectives of reality so that these concepts can be redefined. Dr. Chandra also spoke about shifting disability from the individual to society. The system is responsible for providing a necessary and conducive environment to a disabled person. Subsequently, he answered questions posed to him by students and faculty members.

Dr. Dayal Singh Panwar, the President of 'Saksham' spoke about the need to spread awareness about disability and also emphasized upon creating a more



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inclusive society by treating all human beings as equal. Differently abled people may be different in many ways but in some ways they feel the same as other people. Students, if sensitized about disability can bring about a positive change in society. Speaking about '*Saksham*', he said that the organization is not only engaged in helping disabled people but also makes people aware about disability. The need of the hour was to shift the attitude from vocabularies to the mindset.

Mobile phones equipped with Angel Pro devices and Sony headphones were issued to visually challenged students by the Enabling Unit on the occasion.

The Workshop concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Garima Kumar from the Psychology Department and a member of the Enabling Unit.

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49. A lecture on the topic of the "Position of Women in Sikh Religion"

The Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board (NCWEB) centre at Mata Sundri College organized a lecture on the topic of the "Position of Women in Sikh Religion" in collaboration with Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), on the 19th of December 2018. This was the inaugural lecture of an International Lecture Series. The speaker, Prof. Gurinder Singh Mann from the University of California, gave an important insight on the subject. The lecture began with lighting of the lamp and presentation of bouquets to the dignitaries, followed by the College prayer.

At the outset, Prof. Mann delineated four core areas that the lecture would address, . (a.) How is the subject presently understood? (b.) How to reconcile the problems inherent in this debate? (c.) Building an accurate understanding of gender relations within the Sikh society; and (d.) Examples from art and literature about the importance of women in Sikhism. He began his lecture by calling Guru Nanak Devji as a revolutionary figure who believed in equality of all beings. That is the reason why there is documented evidence of the important role played by women in Sikh history. Prof. Mann was of the view that though all history forgets the contribution made by women but that has not been the case with Sikhism.

Prof. Mann also highlighted the need to look back at history and the historical sources that were contemporary to the Gurus' times, for example, Gurbani, Rahit Literature, arts and the historical sites. He was of the view that Guru Nanak Devji institutionalized the three major tenets of Sikhism which was truly democratic and radical for its times. These were (a.) belief in God as the creator of all beings, so the issues of caste and gender discrimination had no place in his worldview (b.) family was important and therefore there was no place for asceticism and celibacy and (c.) women and children being more vulnerable get special attention in his



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writings. The speaker gave us specific examples from the various manuscripts as well as contemporary times where women have left a mark with their significant contributions in writing, preservation of manuscripts, and spreading awareness about the Sikh religion. One such example is that of Bibi Malan (Guru Gobind Singh Ji's wife) who edited the manuscripts of *Guru Granth Sahib*.

The lecture enriched the knowledge of students and teachers alike and it is hoped that more such lectures are organized in future as well.

The principal Dr. Harpreet Kaur presented a token of remembrance to Dr. Meena Gautam and coordinator(IQAC) Dr. Maneesha Mathur felicitated the principal. The principal was then requested for a welcome address where she formally welcomed the guest speaker, discussed objectives of the National Lecture Series and underlined the importance and relevance of the theme. Ms. Priyanka Kaushik, alumni of Department of History of the college and former student of Dr. Gautam was invited to introduce the speaker and she introduced Dr. Meena Gautam to the audience by sharing her academic journey and professional accomplishments over the decades. The speaker was then requested to deliver her lecture.

Dr. Gautam expressed gratitude to madam principal, IQAC members and college. Through her well-designed PowerPoint presentation, her lecture was very interactive, interesting and full of information. She explained the archives, their importance, types and their crucial relation in research. From methodological intricacies of the archives to the respective government policies, she explicated almost all aspects of archives.

The lecture was followed by a small presentation by Ms. Priyanka Kaushik on career in archives where she focussed on various professional courses available with different archives with special reference to the National Archives of India. She explained the syllabuses, required qualifications, fee and stipends. She also



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informed about the various job opportunities available in the field of archives. The session was concluded with the vote of thanks by coordinator(IQAC) Dr. Manisha Mathur where she thanked speaker for her very valuable lecture, madam principal for her incessant support, team IQAC and B.A. Program Society for their hard work, other support staff for assistance and audience for participation and cooperation.



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51. A Workshop on a very prevalent issue: "Body Image Concerns in Young Adults"

A Counselling Initiative was taken up by the Department of Psychology, Mata Sundri College, in association with IQAC. A Workshop was conducted on a very prevalent issue: "Body Image Concerns in Young Adults". The session was held on the 6 February 2019 at 1 PM in Mata Gujri Hall, and was conducted and facilitated by Dr. Garima Kumar and Dr. Pooja Jaggi.

About 70 students from the *BA (Hons) courses such as Philosophy, Political Science and Mathematics* were present and participated in this Workshop.

The session commenced with Dr. Garima questioning one's own perception of an ideal body image, and how one sees oneself.

The concept that the actual physical appearance of a person is different from the 'perceived appearance' was put forth with the help of a classic phrase, "Mirror, mirror on the wall; who's the fairest of them all ". The very fundamental question; what does one's mirror tell them - resulted in varied responses from students but all of them pointed to the deep rooted societal representation of an 'ideal body'. The idea of how body image develops with time was discussed, by picking up examples from various experiences shared by the audience.

Statistics were shared, that depicted a sharp increase in body image concerns in both Male and females over the years. This helped to bring home the point that having concerns about one's body image were a pervasive phenomenon among young adults everywhere across the world and it was absolutely normal to have questions and apprehensions about the issue.

The role of the media, in influencing one's ideologies about the same, is discussed. Students shared their concerns of how by not promoting body positivity, and



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instilling unhealthy ideals of looking at oneself, media has been harming the well-being of so many people, directly or indirectly.

Dr. Pooja Jaggi highlighted how certain diet plans have become a 'fad' in the Western culture and these are being 'followed' in India as well. A lot of brands and magazines openly demonstrate fake standards of beauty; of how one should look physically. Most of the people however don't know how much editing and photoshop all that media goes through. Due to these factors, a lot of youngsters fall prey to maintaining unhealthy standards, and thus are on the onset to eating and lifestyle disturbances.

Students also shared concerns about societal and parental pressures to conform to certain idealized standards of beauty and sought clarification of ways to deal with these.

The session concluded on a very positive note, Both workshop facilitators emphasized ways in which body positivity can be encouraged and how it could be promoted starting now; one should embrace all sizes, and body types without considering any one as a 'perfect' or 'ideal' body size/type; unhealthy representations by media should be openly challenged. Ways of making a conscious effort not to indulge in or falling prey to '*fat talk*' and promoting body satisfaction and boosting one's self esteem were discussed with students.

Students were also made aware of policies, brands and people who have helped in bringing about this positive change in mindset of people. Techniques to enhance body positivity were highlighted.

Thus, seeing one's own self in a positive way, being able to appreciate oneself and others as a whole person, promoting body positivity, and high self-esteem in themselves and others around them is something all the students learned. Sharing of concerns in a collegial space with the facilitators helped students to open up about their problems in an uninhibited manner. Overall, the workshop was a great success.

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54. Workshop on Intellectual Property Rights by IQAC

The IQAC organized a Workshop on the topic – "INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS" (IPR), on 5 March, 2019 at 1.00 PM in Mata Gujri Hall. It was conducted by Dr. VK Ahuja, In- Charge Law Centre II, University of Delhi for the students and faculty of the college. More than 230 faculty members and students participated in the event.

He explained that Copyrights were economic rights that gave an individual the right to reproduce work, issue copies of the work, perform the work in public, make any cinematographic film or sound recording of the work and obtain rental rights incase of computer programs. This was especially relevant to the students enrolled in various academic courses and helped them get an understanding of the dos and do n'ts while writing an academic paper. Concerns of Ethics in Research, citation issues in academic writing and its importance of producing quality research work was highlighted.



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
57. A Workshop On Hands on training on usage of World Bank Open Data



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
