Research Mentoring, Peer Mentoring and Research Initiatives

Research is an important component of higher studies. It is essential to create a research oriented environment where students learn to pursue research as an activity. The Research Mentoring Program initiated by the college across all departments dedicatedly works to achieve this goal. In addition, interdisciplinary research activities like seminars, conferences and workshops enable us to nurture research skills of both students and staff. To further strengthen collaborative learning, we also encourage our students to learn from each other through our unique Peer-Mentoring programs. Through this program we enable our students to collaborate with each other and take the teaching learning process beyond the classroom.

Research Mentoring - Our 'Research Mentoring' programme is committed to promote interdisciplinary research amongst students, 'Research Mentoring' witnessed students being supervised by an experienced teacher for a full-fledged research project. Students from many departments participated in this program and produced well researched projects. This programme has witnessed a very enthusiastic participation from both students and teachers. As a part of this initiative, research on a diverse range of topics was carried out which is a testimony to the fact that given a conducive environment students could produce well-researched papers under the expert supervision of our faculty members. Peer Mentoring - Our practice of promoting research initiatives and conducting Peer Mentoring amongst undergraduate students is unique as it allows the students to enhance their critical thinking through exchanging ideas with fellow students. The program of Peer Mentoring has allowed students to become scholars and experience learning in a very different atmosphere. It offered a refreshing role reversal where final year students could mentor the freshers. The benefit of this program has been two fold. Students also learnt the skill to articulate their ideas in a manner that is cohesive and comprehensive. The first year students on the other hand witnessed a teaching–learning process that was not tied to books or teachers and enjoyed the freedom to engage in a scholarly debate with their fellow students. Research Initiative - Along with these innovative initiatives, the college organised a myriad of conventional activities in the form of workshops, talks, seminars and conferences which benefited both our faculty and students. DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL SCIENCE Knowledge Club – 2019 – 2020 Knowledge Club sessions are broadly aimed at promoting critical enquiry in students through paper presentations on relevant themes, followed by debates and discussions around them. Session I - 13th September 2019 Topic - America's withdrawal from Afghanistan and its implications on India

The first session of the knowledge club focused on the America's withdrawal from Afghanistan and its implications for India. The topic was very relevant with regard to the contemporary politics and towards understanding of international relations. The students while making their presentation touched upon various aspects related to it. They highlighted how the terrorist attacks of 9/11 on America changed political dynamics across the world. The invasion of Afghanistan by US led forces had profound impact on Asia particularly for South Asia. This session gave a glimpse about the undercurrents at the international political level and how it reflects upon the nations. The US withdrawal from Afghanistan had serious implications for the entire regions especially in terms of stability and peace.




Figure 4 E-Poster

The 2nd session of the knowledge club was centered around the book 1984 written by Georg Orwell. The book is based on a dystopian social science fiction. The book review session was an opportunity for the students to explore readings options beyond their course having significant relevance in contemporary period. While presenting the review the students explored the themes totalitarianism, state, and mass surveillance. It showed how truth and facts are manipulated at the political level, how the government exerts it control over its citizens and why it is important for the people to understand the need to elect correct person to power.




Figure 8 A collage of the Knowledge Club Event in Progress
