

# Annual report of Mata Sundri College (NCWEB) Centre (2018-2019)

## Detail of work done



NCWEB is a unique system where classes are held on Sundays at various teaching centres across Delhi University. Mata Sundri College, one of the centres of NCWEB, enables students' development in both, academic as well as non- academic endeavours. In the academic year 2018-2019, our college organised various programmes and activities that ensured curricular and co-curricular education to students.

The session began with the **Orientation Day** programme held on 12<sup>th</sup> August 2018. The event started with a Shabad Kirtan in the Gurudwara. Dr. Sarabjeet Kaur Sran, teacher-in-charge Mata Sundri College NCWEB centre, gave a welcome address to the new students. She acquainted them with different aspects pertinent to college life-- attendance, classes and norms for maintaining discipline. Then Principal Dr Kwarnjit Kaur addressed the students.

### **Number of Students admitted in the Academic Year**

The academic session received an overwhelming response from the students from different parts of the country. The NCWEB centre admitted 244 students in B.A program and 172 students in B.com program this year. These students got an opportunity to attend full-day lectures on every Sunday where they received a professional boost by our enthusiastic faculty members. Furthermore, these highly motivated faculty members are directly recruited from NCWEB office, North Campus, University of Delhi to cater to the academic needs of our prestigious Sunday study centre.

Along with regular lectures, our students participated in various inter-college and intra-college co-curricular activities. They actively participated in such events organized by different colleges and won prizes. On 16<sup>th</sup> of October, '100 Sawal Mukaabla' (100 question competition) was organized at **Dyal Singh College** where our students **Pritam Kaur and Ishani of BA First year, won the second prize.**

On 21<sup>st</sup> of October 2018 a number of competitions were organised at our centre, Mata Sundri College, and our students came out with flying colours.

**Poster Making Competition** :Shweta of B.A. Second year bagged the first position while two students from B.Com Third year, Amanpreet Kaur, and Siya Rani shared the second position.



**Poetry Competition** where students were at their creative best, expressing their thoughts in beautifully composed poems. Aafreen Khan of B.A. Second year stood first and Anjarun of B.Com Second year came second.

**Annual Sports Day and Cultural Programme** were held on 6<sup>th</sup> January 2019. Sports Day included various competitions like 100 metres race, lemon race, sack race, 3-leg race, and relay race. Sneha of B.Com First year and Priya Das B.Com Third year won the first and second position respectively in 100-metre race. Silvi and Jeenat led the Lemon race while Sneha of B.Com First year bagged the first position in Sack Race. Three-leg Race saw girls from B.Com, Sneha, Mehak and Pooja Goel, rule the roost. ## TALK “YOUTH LEADERSHIP”

Progressing towards a positive culmination of the academic session 2018-2019, the centre organised a lecture on “**Youth Leadership**” by Dr. Baltej Singh Mann, Member National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions, on March 18<sup>th</sup>, 2019. The event began with a lamp lighting session by Dr. Mann, accompanied by our respected Principal Dr Harpreet Kaur and NCWEB Teacher-in-charge. Dr. Sarabjeet Kaur opened the event with an insightful introduction about the august speaker for the occasion. Soon after, our college **Principal Dr Harpreet Kaur** addressed the students, sharing her thoughts on Youth Leadership. She emphasized on the importance of combining education with a requisite skill-set to excel in the knowledge society of today. She urged the students to introspect on their career options and make an informed choice. Thereafter, Dr. Mann took the centre stage beginning his discussion by raising a question relevant to our times—the issue of division and disparity along lines of religion, caste and class and whether this pattern befits a society that is democratic in nature. He referred to a number of recent incidents while discussing the issue and emphasized that young people should understand the inanity of such biases and always question them. Thereafter, he highlighted the significance of government scholarships to students belonging to a social or economic minority and spelt out various schemes that have already been implemented. He concluded his insightful lecture with three crucial phrases for the students to model their lives on—Working Hard, Being Successful and Keeping Happy.





The series of events for the session came to a close with our college hosting fourteen other colleges of NCWEB at a **Cultural event organised on March 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2019**. It was a Folk Dance Competition involving spellbinding performances by students of fourteen NCWEB centres across Delhi University.

The event was aimed at reinforcing the value of Indian culture amongst students and kindle a healthy competitive spirit in them. It was a huge success with a number of dignitaries in attendance. The programme started with the welcome of eminent guests by Dr Sarabjit Kaur, the Teacher In-charge. Dr Indu Kumari, the Deputy Coordinator, welcomed Ms Kalpana Sharma while Dr Sarabjit Kaur welcomed Ms Upasana Aggarwal. The event started with a prayer and the lighting of the ceremonial lamp. After the competition, Dr Manu Sharma, Ms Kalpana and Mr Manjeet Singh Rai addressed the audience while talking about women empowerment and the importance of the teachings of medieval saints in today's "modern" world. At last, the founder of Dakshina Foundation, Upasana Aggarwal and the Teacher In-charge, Dr Sarabjit Kaur, gave the thanking speeches.

### **Sports Day**

1. 100 Meter Race

It is a sprint race in track and field competitions. Priya Das from B.Com (3<sup>rd</sup> Year) came first, Sonali from B.Com (1<sup>st</sup> Year) came second, and Gursimran from B.Com (3<sup>rd</sup> Year) came third.

2. Sack Race



In this race, participants place both of their legs inside a sack and hop-forward towards a finish line. Sneha Panwar from B.Com (2<sup>nd</sup> Year) came first, Priya Das from B.Com (3<sup>rd</sup>Year) came second, and Ashi from B.Com (2<sup>nd</sup> Year) came third.



### 3. Lemon Race

In this race, participants must balance a lemon upon a spoon and run with it to the finishing line. Sneha Panwar from B.Com (2<sup>nd</sup> Year) came first, Zeenat Khan from B.A. (2<sup>nd</sup> Year) came second, and Preeti from B.A (3<sup>rd</sup> Year) came third.

### 4. Relay Race

In this race, members of a team take turns completing parts of racecourse. The first position went to Sneha Panwar and Priya Das from B.Com (3<sup>rd</sup> Year), the second position to Anjali and Shaily from B. Com (2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Years), and the third position to Meena and Nisha from B.A. (3<sup>rd</sup> Year) and B.Com (2<sup>nd</sup> Year) respectively.

### 5. Three-Legged Race

In this race, participants run on three legs, that is, each partner has her leg strapped to another. The first position went to Sneha Panwar and Priya Das from B.Com (2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Years), the second position to Shweta and Nancy from B. Com (1<sup>st</sup> Year) and B.A.

#### 6. Needle-Thread Race

- Poster Making Competition



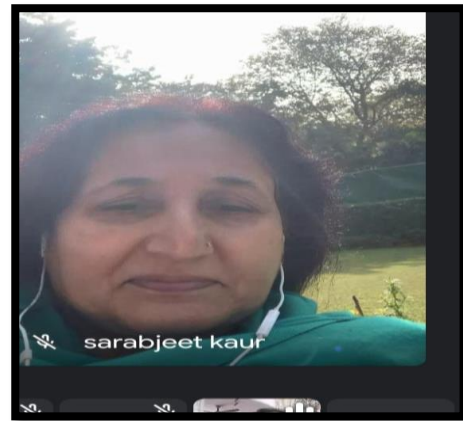

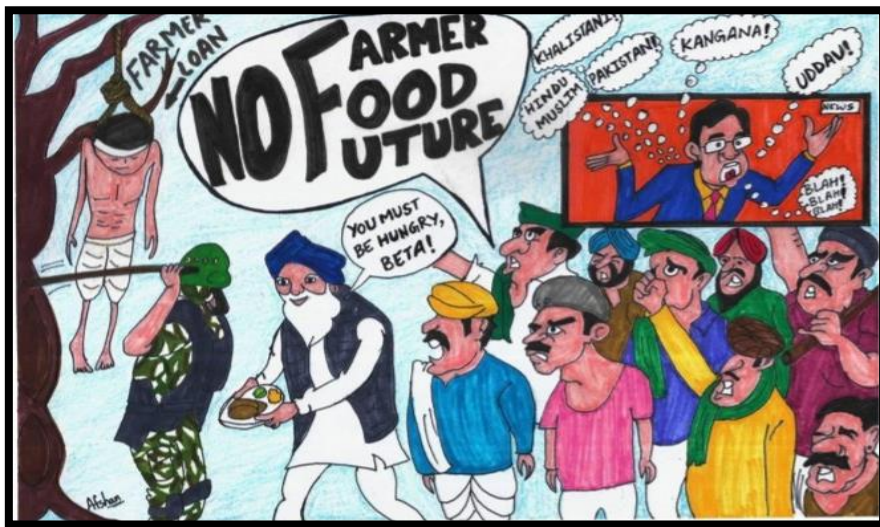
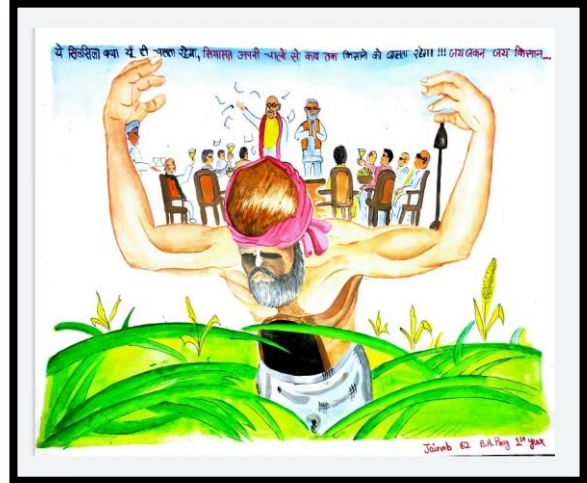
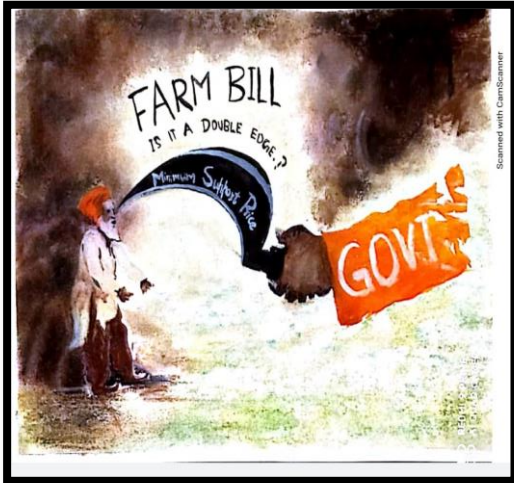


## 7. Essay Writing Competition

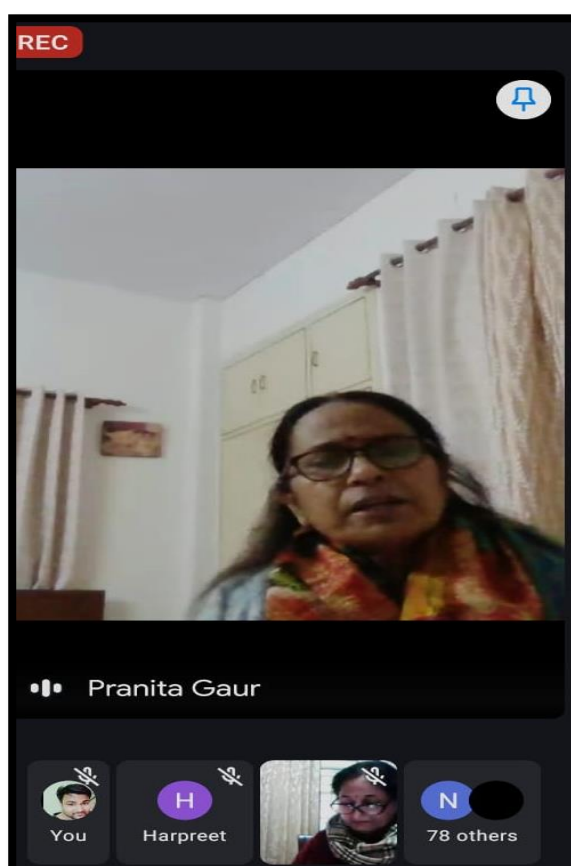
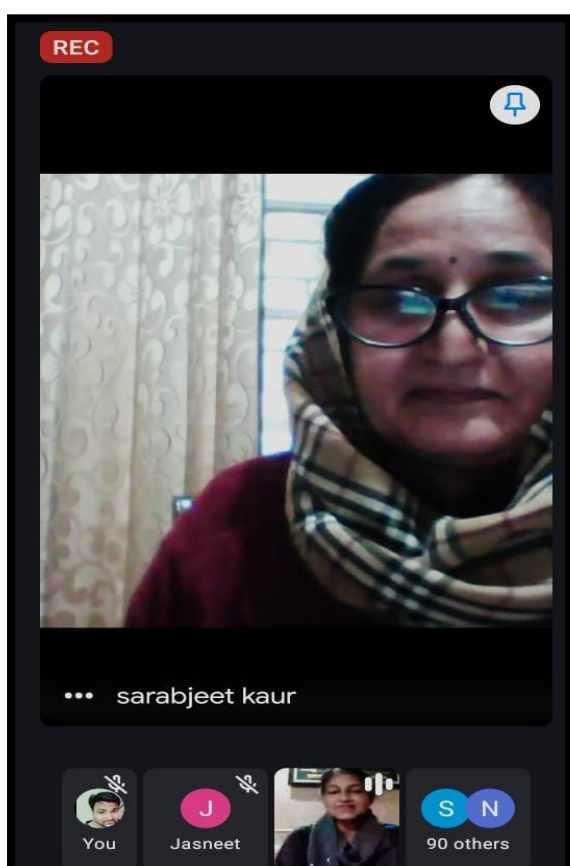
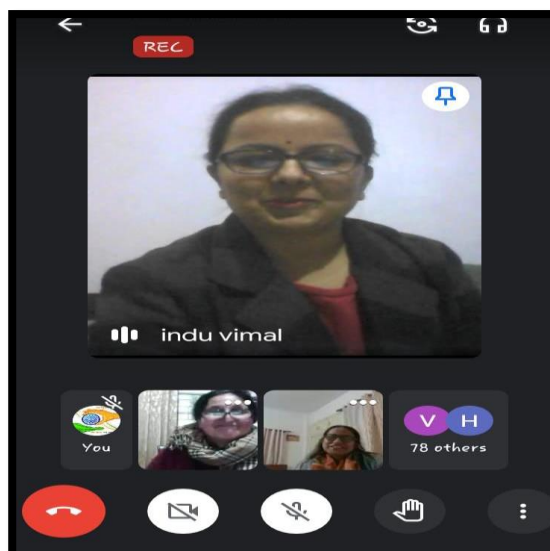
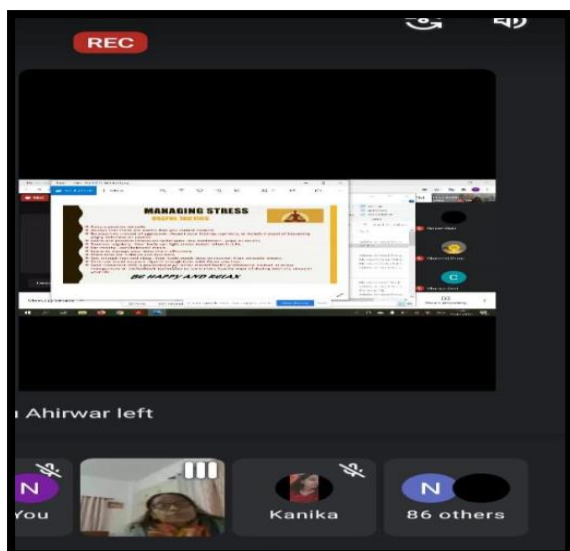
## 8. Poster Making Competition
