



COUNSELLING: A SKILLED BASED COUNSELLING SESSION

On 29th January 2021, Invictus – Commerce Department, IQAC and Kasak, the B. A. Programme Society of Mata Sundri College for Women, University of Delhi held a skill based counseling session on “Skills And Competencies Agenda And Enhancing Employment And Work Participation Of Women”. The event was graced by Prof. (Dr.) Harpreet Kaur, principal of MSCW. The scholarly speakers were Dr. Harinder M. Sandhu, Department of Psychology, Dr. Lokesh Gupta, Coordinator of the IQAC, and Dr. Manisha Mathur, Deputy Coordinator of IQAC.

The event started by seeking the blessings of Mata Sundri Ji followed by the introduction of our eminent speakers by Dr. Harinder Sandhu amongst 350+ audience participation.

Dr. Harpreet Kaur welcomed Dr. Manish Kumar, chief executive officer, National Skill Development Corporation. She explained the significance of counselling for students, appreciating the team for conceptualizing the event. She put forth the major aim of creating women leaders as we are attached to a women's college. This session would help students to know about the avenues which are available for them and the kind of changes to become successful entrepreneurs and in employment fields too. It gives an opportunity for skill development and economic independence for women which can put

problems like gender discrimination to an end. She also acclaimed soft skills required for women such as leadership, management, and self-confidence.



Dr. Manish Kumar gave an overall view of skills. He explained that skills have three aspects i.e cognitive skills which are used by academic institutions to solve problems, non-cognitive skills which are the ability of a person to interact with society, and technical vocational skills which are learned by doing any task. His technological changes are life-transforming. He emphasized on the internet as it has changed the kind of skills required at the workplace. The second aspect he talked about was demographic window opportunity. Then he briefed upon the work of NSTC i.e they are developmental financing institutions, lends corporation money to the private sector for skilling, and contributed to many government programs. He says that the entire structure is based on competencies. He also talked about job roles and prime minister kaushal Kendra which is held in each district. He also talks about the percentage of female participation in some countries.



The session was well applauded by all the attendees who got a new insight about technology, skills and women empowerment. Dr. Manish Kumar helped us to understand the concept of skills and technology.

Towards the end of this session a few questions were asked by Dr. Manisha Mathur, all doubts were cleared and Dr. Niti Arora was invited by Dr. Harjinder Kaur to deliver a formal vote of thanks to Dr. Manish Kumar.
