PEER MENTORSHIP SESSION ON

Managing Online Teaching-Learning Sessions: **“Getting Started with Google Classroom and Google Meet”**

Online education enables the teacher and the students to set their own learning pace, and there's the added flexibility of setting a schedule that fits everyone's agenda. As a result, using an online educational platform allows for a better balance of work and studies. Due to Covid'19 pandemic, education is also facing a big hit.

The takeaway from the session included how to join and host a meeting, use the audio/video and present screen option, record a meeting, join and create a class, deal with assignments and grades, work with to-do list, How to post public and private comments, How to manage notifications and customize settings, save and access the uploaded materials using both application (mobile) and web interface.
