TIPS TO CRACK M.A. ENTRANCE EXAM: GET YOUR QUERIES ANSWERED

An interactive talk session was organized by Department of Economics, Mata Sundri College for Women, University of Delhi in association with Motivational to Master's cell and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) on 28 September 2021. The purpose of the session was to enlighten the students regarding the various options available for pursuing master's in economics. It made them learn about the universities offering master's and the structure of their entrance procedure. At the inaugural ceremony, the Teacher Coordinator Ms. Shivani Verma delivered the welcome speech and explained the importance of the session to the students.
