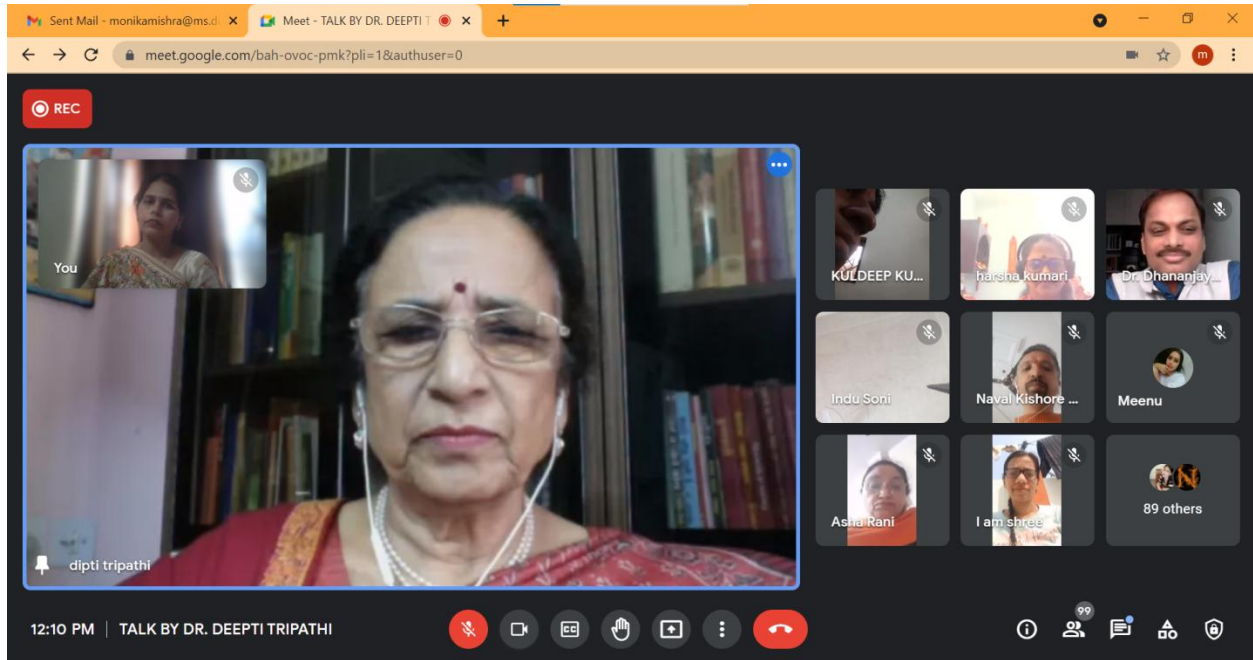


TALK BY PROF. DEEPTI TRIPATHI

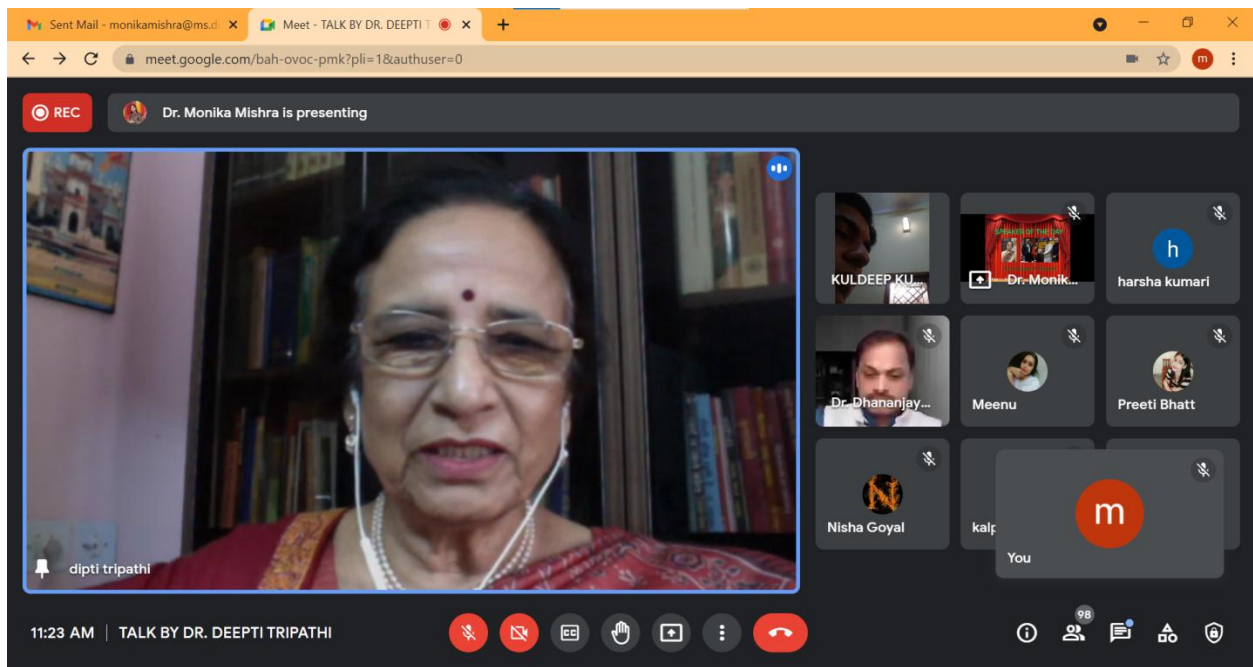
On 26 November, 2021, A Webinar was organized by the Sanskrit-Department on the topic "Educational problems and solutions of Sanskrit students" through virtual medium. The program was formally started with invocation by Preeti Bhatt, the alumni of the college, praising the goddess of knowledge, Saraswati. Professor Deepti Tripathi (Retd.), Senior Lecturer, Department of Sanskrit, University of Delhi was the speaker of this seminar.

The teacher of the department, Dr. Harsha Kumari apprised the audience about the personality and work of the Chief Guest Prof. Tripathi. Prof. Tripathi described Sanskrit as the cultural heritage of India. He said that Sanskrit language connects us with culture. Sharing his educational experiences, he threw light on the misconceptions about language in students' life. Explained the difference between Sanskrit subject and Sanskrit language. Learning a language in its purest form always requires constant reading and practice. Prof. Tripathi also interacted with the students in this lecture of two hours.



Prachi, a student of Lady Shri Ram College, presented a curiosity to make Sanskrit language the medium for success in the IAS examination. Priyanka, a student of Kamala Nehru Mahavidyalaya, asked a question to change the social mindset regarding Sanskrit language. Laxmi Rajput, a student of Jamia Millia Islamia University, asked a question about livelihood from Sanskrit language. Prof. Tripathi also simplified the difficulty of student Priya Jha that how to memorize Sanskrit shlokas.

Dr. Rajiv Mishra, an instructor associated with Sanskrit Sansthan, Lucknow, told how he imparts knowledge of Shrimad Bhagvad Gita in Sanskrit and Hindi language to technical students and how they can improve it further. Prof. Tripathi answered all the thematic questions and satisfied their unanswered curiosities.
