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“WITHER THE PEOPLE'S MOVEMENTS IN INDIA?” THE CASE OF NATIONAL ALLIANCE OF PEOPLE'S MOVEMENT

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ABSTRACT

In order to *survive social movements must categorically maintain their autonomy from the established institutional and ideological structures if they are to give their own alternative paradigm*. And they also need to maintain, *a dialectical balance between its urge to institutionalise and radicalize*.
