Introduction

Guru Nanak Dev preached basic principles of humanity that later took the form of a new distinctive faith. The universal vision of Guru Nanak elucidates a world society eliminating all sorts of differences and dissensions. The regressive tendencies and redundant traditions of the society were challenged by Him and an alternative order was proposed by the Guru that was assimilative. Guru Nanak was called as the guide of the people of the world and says, "Jahar Pir Jagat Gur Baba". The religious and socio-economic philosophy of Guru Nanak is futuristic having strong reflections of desired values of the modern society.
