Paper Presentation Competition

The Northeast Cell of Mata Sundri College for Women organized a Paper Presentation Competition on 13th April at Bebe Nanki Hall. The event commenced at 12:30 p.m. and continued till 3:00 p.m., with active participation from students across Delhi University. It was conducted under the guidance of the Nodal Officers, Mrs. Roselin Sekho and Dr. Divya Pradhan, with the aim of bringing Northeast narratives from the margins to the mainstream.

The program began with the felicitation of the Principal, Professor Harpreet Kaur, along with the judges, Dr. Neetu Sharma and Dr. Moitri Dey. Following this, the competition commenced in an engaging and intellectually enriching atmosphere.

A total of 19 participants from 10 different colleges of Delhi University participated in the competition, each speaking for 5 to 7 minutes. The topics covered included identity and belonging, psychological challenges faced by Northeast students, the role of the Brahmaputra Valley in shaping regional history, the impact of sports in empowering youth, and the importance of oral traditions and folklore.

The event saw enthusiastic participation of the students. At the end, the winners were announced: Alangkrita Goswami (Miranda House) secured first position, Suklenmung Chetia (Hindu College) second, and Shrestha Giri (Mata Sundri College for Women) third. Winners received cash prizes and certificates, while all participants were awarded certificates of participation.

The event concluded on a successful note, promoting awareness, inclusivity, and meaningful academic dialogue on Northeast India.
