Report on the Intra-College Paper Presentation & Poster Making Competition

The Intra-College Paper Presentation and Poster Making Competition was organised by the Minority Cell of Mata Sundri College for Women, University of Delhi, in collaboration with the Viksit Bharat Secretariat. The event was held at Mata Gujri Hall on 27 March 2026. The theme for the competition was “India’s Knowledge Traditions: Conservation, Continuity and Cultural Heritage

The paper presentation session had a wide range of interesting topics for discussion. One such paper presentation was on "Babal da Bera and Suhag," which showed how Dogri folk songs portray the emotional change in women's lives when they are married off and how they feel alienated from their own families. Another such paper presentation was on "Maangal Geet as a Living Archive," which tried to show how these wedding songs of Uttarakhand are a living archive while trying to adjust to the new digital world. Another such paper presentation was on the educational role of minority institutions and how they have impacted education and social change in society by referring to constitutional provisions and the literacy gap.

The Intra College Paper Presentation and Poster Making Competition was organized by Mata Sundri College for Women, University of Delhi's Minority Cell, and Viksit Bharat Secretariat at Mata Gujri Hall on March 27, 2023. The topic of the event was "India's Knowledge Traditions: Conservation, Continuity and Cultural Heritage.".
