Parivartan, the NSS unit of Mata Sundri College for Women organised a poster making competition on the topic, ‘The National Flag of India: Symbol of Honour’ on 23 November, 2021 at 5:00 PM. The saffron, white, and green stripes of the flag of India represent distinct values of the country. The Ashoka Chakra is rendered in navy blue on a white background replacing the symbol of the charkha of the pre-independence version of the flag. The chakra signifies that there is life in movement and death in stagnation. It represents the dynamism of a peaceful change.

Drawing the Tricolour aroused the hearts of volunteers and piqued their curiosity to know more about the national flag, its history and how the final design came about after various stages of renditions. Volunteers along with honing their creative artistic skills, depicted their thoughts and deep respect for the national flag through their brushes and colour palette alike.
