Parivartan, The NSS unit of Mata Sundri College for Women organized 'Skit' on 26th of August, 2021. It was celebrated under Women's Equality Day. We made a narrative skit video about the life of "ARUNIMA SINHA", first female amputee to climb Everest in the world.

Arunima Sinha who was born in 1988 from Ambedkar Nagar in Uttar Pradesh is the first Indian amputee to climb Mount Everest. She is also the first female amputee to climb the Everest. She was a national level volleyball player before the horrible accident which left her an amputee. Sinha was pushed from a running train by some robbers in 2011 while she was resisting them. Sinha has been featured as one of the 'People of the Year' in the 27th edition (2016) of Limca Book of Records. She was also been awarded Padma Shri, the fourth highest civilian award of India in 2015. Sinha is Awarded Tenzing Norgay Highest Mountaineering Award in India.

Arunima Sinha is now dedicated towards social welfare and wants to open a free sports academy for the poor and differently abled people. She is donating all the financial aids she is getting through awards and seminars for the same cause. The academy would be named Shaheed Chandra Shekhar Vikalang Khel Academy.

She wrote the 2014 book *Born Again on The Mountain*.

She was awarded Padma Shri, the fourth highest civilian award of India, in 2015. She was Awarded Tenzing Norgay Highest Mountaineering Award in India same as Arjun Award

Volunteers participated in this event. When women and girls get full access to their rights will they be able to enjoy a life of freedom. It includes everything from equal pay to land ownership rights and more. Further a Country can only transform when its women get an equal say in everything and are treated equally.
