The Global Corruption Barometer (GCB) – Asia, found that nearly 50 percent of those who paid bribes were asked to, while 32 percent of those who used personal connections said they would not receive the service otherwise. That's why all volunteers pledged to take steps in order to curbing down corruption and promote transparency.

The theme for 2021's Vigilance Awareness Week was 'Independent India @75 - Self-Reliant with Integrity' and it is driven by Central Vigilance Commission. It coincides with the birthday of 'Iron Man of India', Sardar Valla Bhai Patel who played a key role in the political integration of 565 princely states to independent India. The initiative aims to bring together all the stakeholders when fighting against the scourge of corruption. Promoting transparency and honesty, especially in educational institutions and corporations, as well as strengthening anti-corruption institutions might be the way forward for India if it truly wants to achieve its socio-economic development goals.
